Utility property value increases in Oregon

The value of utility property in Oregon has increased 6.5 percent in the past year. Statewide, utility property is appraised at \$5.2 billion for the 1981-82 property tax year, up from the 1980-81 value of \$4.8 billion.

Figures were released by the Oregon Department of Revenue, which appraises privately-owned utilities. The revenue department provides figures to county assessors, who place the

value on local tax rolls.

Revenue Director Robyn L. Godwin completed his annual review of the appraisals July 7 and will certify the figures to county assessors.

"Utilities pay a substantial amount of property tax — nearly \$64 million last year," noted Godwin.

Utility property accounted for 6.6 percent of taxable property in Oregon in 1980. It includes property owned by airlines, railroads, telephone, water, electric and gas companies and other regulated industries. This year's appraisals included 541 companies, up from 503 last year. Utilities owned by local, state or federal governments are exempt from property tax.

The state's largest utility property owner continued to be Portland General Electric, with property valued at \$1.4 billion. The smallest utility appraised was Portland's East 72nd Street Water System, which owns one pipeline valued at \$180.

This year's biggest dollar increase in value was in the gas pipeline utilities. One leg of the Alaskan pipeline was being constructed in north-eastern Oregon, adding \$42 million in value.
