

Delinquent tax collections underestimated

Delinquent tax collections by the Oregon Department of Revenue are \$3.5 million higher than the amount targeted by the Legislature in a special 10-month project.

The revenue department collected \$44.5 million between Sept. 1, 1980 and June 30, 1981. The goal was \$41 million.

The project was established by the special session of the Legislature last summer to help balance the state's budget. Lawmakers wanted the revenue department to collect \$10 million beyond the amount normally collected during the year.

To meet the goal, the revenue department temporarily re-assigned 39 employees from various parts of the agency to the Collection Division staff.

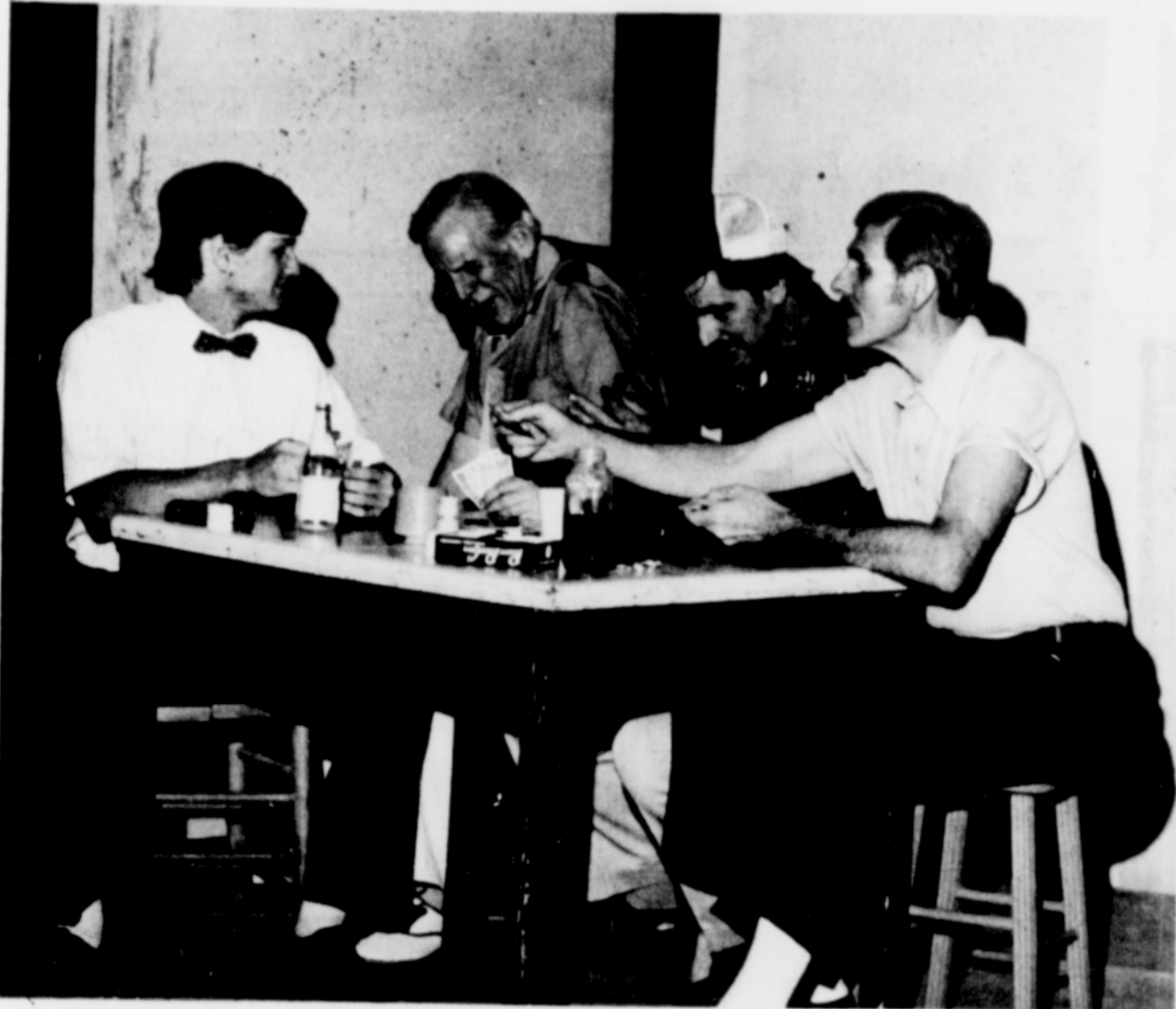
