

Traffic death toll similar to last year

Fifty-nine persons died in Oregon traffic accidents in June. The count compares with 60 June deaths last year.

Although little improvement was seen in the monthly comparison, the June toll brought the six-month count to 266, 11 percent below the 300 fatalities recorded for the first half of 1980.

Pedestrian and motorcyclist fatalities, included in the total, also dropped during the period.

Thirty pedestrians died during the first half of 1981, a drop of 25 percent from the 40 pedestrian deaths recorded for the same period a year ago.

Twenty-seven motorcyclists were killed during the first half of 1981, a drop of 18 percent. Thirty-three motorcyclists died during the same period last year.
