County officials' pay jumps

Clackamas County's elected officials and top and middle management employees received a salary hike this month.

The three county commissioners, sheriff and other elected officials received a total salary and benefits package increase of 13.9 percent. Officials individually determined what portion of the increase they preferred in salary or benefits, but could not take more than 8.68 percent in salary, according to Carole Berggren, county budget analyst.

Commissioners' annual

salaries before the increase were \$36,576. Sheriff Paul McAllister's salary was \$38,520.

The county's 23 employees in top management positions received a 7.5 percent salary increase, while salaries of 135 middle management employees increased by 8.6 percent.

Commissioner Stan Skoko objected to the management salary increase, preferring a blanket dollar increase rather than a percentage and complaining that he had not been informed of the hike before the (July 9) meeting.

The management pay hike was approved by a 2-1 vote, Skoko opposing it.
