Ark-seeker set for talk

Elfred Lee is probably the only living person who knows where Noah's Ark is located.

Next Sunday, Aug. 2, he will share his first-hand experience on an expedition to locate the ark. This event will take place at East Hill Auditorium, 701 N. Main St., Gresham, at 6 p.m.

The expedition team encountered intrigue, storms and fire. Lee will supplement his account with movies and slides.

It was in 1969 that Lee went as expedition photographer and illustrator with a team of men chosen to investigate reports of a boat-shaped artifact. Fragments

of ancient wood were unearthed at the site on the borders of Iran and Russia. Here, in northeastern Turkey, in a cluster of moun-

tain peaks called the mountains of Ararat, is where the Bible says Noah's Ark came to rest.

Lee became good friends with George Hagopian, an elderly Armenian raised in the area. Hagopian, now deceased, told of standing on the ark. Experts conclude his accounts are true.

Lee has spoken on radio and television and lectured to audiences across the United States, Canada and South America. Recently he participated in the movie, "In Search of Noah's Ark," which has been shown in theaters and on television. The event is open to the public.

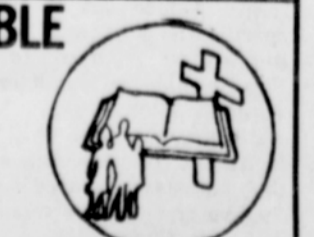
