

## BMAC pair places at state swim meet

A pair of Blue Marlin Aquatic Club swimmers placed recently at the Oregon Association Age Group Swimming Championships held at South Albany High School.

Damon Hodge, competing in the eight-and-under category, was the top point-getter for the BMAC. Hodge placed fourth in the 50-meter butterfly, 44.18; fifth in the 100-meter freestyle, 1:27.63; sixth in the 50-meter breaststroke, 57.74; and sixth in the 50-meter freestyle, 39.81.

He also had a personal best time in the 50-meter backstroke of 53.76.

BMAC's only other point-getter was 13-year-old Doug Crane. Crane placed fifth in the 50-meter freestyle, 27.91, and fifth in the 100-meter butterfly, 1:09.05.

He also had personal bests in the 200-meter individual medley, 2:39.65; 100-meter breaststroke, 1:26.18; 200-meter freestyle, 2:16.59; 100-meter freestyle, 1:01.34; and 200-meter backstroke, 2:49.63.

There were a number of other good swims, according to BMAC coach Carl Neuenfeldt.

Ian Hodge scored personal bests in the 50-meter butterfly, 43.81, and the 50-meter freestyle, 38.02. Terri Hanson's 3:02.4 was a PR in the girls 200-meter butterfly; Richard Rolph had best times in the 400-meter freestyle, 4:55.99, the 200-meter freestyle, 2:19.35, and the 200-meter backstroke, 2:47.84; and Jean Crane had a best in the 100-meter freestyle, 1:13.03.



Gayle Roth cleared 4-11 in the high jump and claimed second place in the Junior Olympic Regional Heptathlon competition in Seattle last weekend. Roth had a total of 3,890 points and qualified for nationals.

## SUHS spikers place at regional heptathlon

Three Sandy High School track athletes placed in the Junior Olympic Regional Heptathlon last weekend in Seattle.

Gayle Roth finished second in the 17-18 girls competition, Sharon Jensen was third in the 15-16 girls and Crystal Calkins was sixth in the 15-16 girls.

Roth, who will be a senior next season, qualified for nationals with her second place finish of 3,890 points, but will probably bow out because of the financial obligations of going to the meet in Lincoln, Neb., at the end of the month.

Roth's marks in Seattle were: 800 meters, 2:27.47; shot put, 25.7; 100-hurdles, 16.8; high jump, 4-11; 200 meters, 28.8; long jump, 13-10; and javelin, 69-8 1/2.

Jensen, who will be a sophomore next year, missed by one spot a trip to nationals with her 3,747 total. Her marks were: 100-hurdles, 18.6; shot put, 26-2 1/2; high jump, 4-6; 200 meters, 28.6; long jump, 14-8 1/2; javelin, 84-5; and 800 meters, 2:32.7.

Calkins, also a sophomore-to-be, was sixth with a total of 2,839. Her marks were: 100-hurdles, 20.2; shot put, 24-10; high jump, 4-1 1/2; 200 meters, 29.8; long jump, 14-6; javelin, 53-6; and 800 meters, 2:57.0.

Stephanie Hagstrom, who will be a senior at SUHS next year, qualified for nationals in the javelin. She had a best throw of 134-0, second in the 17-18 girls competition.

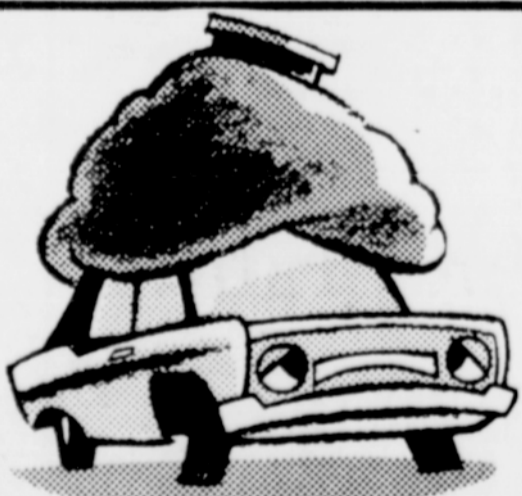


IAN HODGE

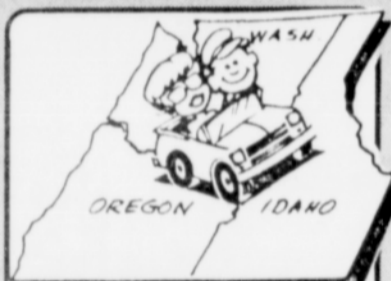
