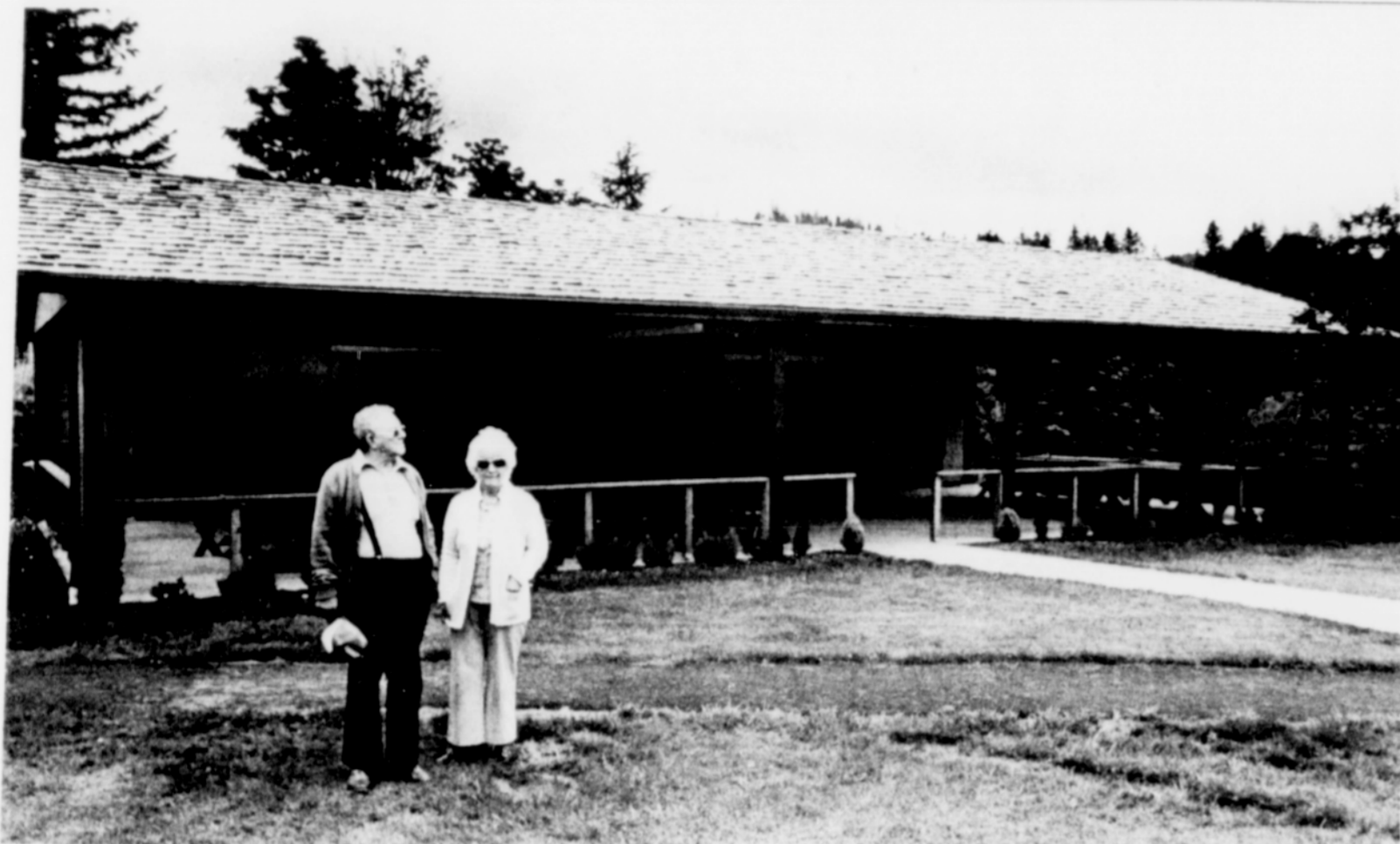

## Photo contest set at fair

Amateur photographers will have the opportunity to exhibit their best work during the Clackamas County Fair Aug. 18-22.

Deadline for entries in the photo contest, both color and black and white, is Aug. 4. All amateur photographers living in Oregon are eligible to compete. There will be an entry fee of 25 cents for each print submitted with a limit of four in each category. Prints must have been taken by the exhibitor and not previously won a prize at the fair.

Black and white prints will be classified by several topics including landscapes; seascapes; buildings, animals, birds, insects and fish; flowers, trees and plant life; still life, patterns and textures; and miscellaneous.

Color print topics are landscapes; seascapes; animals, birds, insects and fish; flowers, trees and plant life; portraits of people; and

miscellaneous.

Prizes will be \$5 for first, \$3 for second and \$2 for third. Several awards are also being offered, including \$25 and \$15 gift certificates.

A special \$25 prize will be given to the picture, black and white or color, which best depicts the 1981 fair theme: An Old Fashioned Fair... 75 Years of Progress.

All entries submitted by mail should be addressed to Photography Salon, Clackamas County Fair, Box 658, Canby, OR, 97013.

A combined fashion show and sheep showmanship event will be held again this year.

The event features models who will exhibit the sheep from which their garments were made. Entrants must be 13 years of age or older and model a garment made of no less than 70 percent wool. Sheep may be of any breed, no rams, and the entrant need not own the animal.

Participants will be judged 50 percent on the garment, 25 percent on handling of the sheep and 25 percent on the appearance of the sheep.

An entry fee of \$2 is required. There will be three categories: ages 13-18, 19-23 and 24-and-over.

The show will be held Aug. 20 at 7 p.m.

Retail outlets in Clackamas County are now distributing free coupons which entitle youngsters to price reductions on carnival rides during Family Day, Aug. 19.

The Rainier Shows carnival will return again this year with several new midway innovations.

Special programs and entertainment for the family are slated for the Wednesday activities. Youngsters under 16, when accompanied by adults, will be admitted to the fair free that day.

## Law appointed new ESD head

Marvin Law was named chairman of the board of the Clackamas County Education Service District (ESD) last week.

Law replaces Keith Lindahl, who served as chairman during the 1980-81 fiscal year. The ESD fiscal year began July 1.

Clayton Wills of Redland was named vice-chairman, a position served by Law last year. Wills is the ESD board member for Zone V, which includes Sandy, Boring, Redland, Estacada, Damascus and Gladstone.

The meeting was also the first for new board members John Rowell of Sandy and Charles Lucht of Molalla.

ESD superintendent Bob Burns was reappointed budget officer and election officer by the board.

The ESD also voted to extend its lease on Marian Hall on the Marylhurst campus an additional five years. The present lease expires in 1984.

The terms of the lease are such that Marylhurst will increase the ESD's existing warehouse space to 3,000 square feet with loading docks and some office space. The enlarged warehouse will be the distribution center for the ESD's cooperative purchasing program.

The board also accepted a \$21,000 grant for the upcoming school year from the Northwest Area Foundation to hire a talented and gifted consultant to serve Clackamas County schools.

The consultant, Marilyn Hess of Portland, will work with any of the 28 school districts in Clackamas County. She will help schools design talented and gifted programs, write curriculum, find resources and act as liaison with other talented and gifted programs.

This will be the third year the ESD has received grants from the Foundation for Talented and Gifted Programs. In the past, money has helped to develop talented

and gifted identification programs and to fund the Clackamas County Cultural Studies Program.

This will be Hess' second year working with talented and gifted programs through the ESSD. Last year she did similar work for the ESD, also funded in part by the foundation.

The ESD board gave a special award and certification of appreciation to Safety Bug Harriet Harries at its July meeting.
