Weaving exhibit set

A reception will be held this Saturday, Aug. 1, for Phid Simons at the Wy'East Gallery Shop in Rhododendron.

It will be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Simons' show, "Tarascan Lace and Other Weavings" is being held at the gallery, located on the north side of U.S. Highway 26, some 17 miles east of Sandy.

Simons was trained by the Tarascan Indians in Guatemala and uses a backstrap loom. The lace is

a special technique developed by the Guatemalans and is utilized in making a variety of objects, including hangings, purses, articles of clothing and pillow covers.

Wine and refreshments will be served throughout the day and Simons will be on hand to discuss and demonstrate her work.

Other members of the guild will also demonstrate and variety of different art skills outside the gallery shop, weather permitting.

Art entry deadline Sept. 3

Sept. 3 has been set as the deadline for entries at the third annual Gresham Get Together Days art exhibit.
