**Hydro hearing set Friday**

**Friday, July 31**  
The Water Policy Review Board will hold a public hearing at the Sandy Community Center, 38348 Pioneer Blvd., at 10:30 a.m. on the preliminary permit application submitted by S.S. Investments dba Steven Sweitzer to utilize 60 cubic feet per second of water from Boulder Creek for hydroelectric power. Boulder Creek is a tributary of the Salmon River. The proposed project, near Brightwood, involves construction of an inlet diversion structure, penstock, power plant and an upgrade power transmission line.

**Saturday, Aug. 1**  
The city of Sandy is sponsoring a free family day-hike to Ramona Falls. Participants should meet at the Sandy Community Center at

**Youth arrested after attempted theft**

Activity recently at the park has included preliminary work on paving the road to the lower level and spreading and rolling the gravel base for the road

around the trailer court area. A blacktopped foot path was also laid the length of the court, from the utility room to the North end.
