Variety of entertainment on tap for county fair

The 75th annual Clackamas County Fair will feature a variety of entertainment and special events this year.

The fair will run Aug. 18-22 at the Canby Fairgrounds.

Models from Jantzen will show off turn-of-the-century swim suits, entertainers will sing and play old-time songs and the old-time fiddlers will play their brand of foot-stomping music to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee Fair.

The fairgrounds outdoor stage will be alive with action constantly, with shows slated on the hour, every hour, from 1 p.m. until late evening, according to fair entertainment director Carol Lukens.

Headliners will be Jo Anna

Burns, who sings everything from opera to country, and Robbie Robinson, a versatile singer of rock, country and rhythm and blues. Both have entertained all up and down the West Coast.

Burns will be featured in an opening day presentation at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 19, and will put on two shows each on the final two days of the fair. Robinson has a similar schedule.

A series of daily fashion shows, put on by well-known clothing manufacturers, will be a new feature of the fair's entertainment program this year. Kids' Day will be opening day, featuring fashions for the young set. Fashions for the Big and Beautiful will take over Wednesday, and the Jantzen girls will model

the old-style swim suits Thursday. A men's fashion show will be held Friday and mixed fashions on Saturday. The fashion shows will kick off each day's performances at 1 p.m.

Another new attraction will be a presentation of Oregon beauty queens, both past and present. Those on hand to greet fairgoers will include Dawn Lewis, Miss Oregon U.S.A. 1961; Candace Ryan, this year's Mrs. Oregon; Dana Garrett, Mrs. Oregon 1980; and Diana Miller, Mrs. Oregon 1978, who will also emcee the show.

The Beauty Queens of Oregon will also appear in a one-hour show from 2 to 3 p.m. on Family Day at the fair, set Wednesday, Aug. 19.

The fair's talent show, featuring both junior and adult talent, will be held Tuesday, Aug. 18, at 8 p.m. Dave Hood of KGW TV will serve as master of ceremonies.

Magician and escape artist Mel Anderson will perform opening day. Joni Harms, western singer and this year's Miss Clackamas County Fair Rodeo, will ap-

pear with her band Wednesday afternoon.

Other entertainment attractions at the fair will include the Sweet Adelines, the Killingsworth Brothers singing duo, Doris and her belly dancers, Radio Flyers trio band, Heck Harper, the Gresham Hotshots, the Oregon City Senior Shufflers, the Cam and Phil singing duo and the Maralee

Dancers.

Old-time fiddlers from all over Oregon will come to the fair on Senior Citizens Day, Aug. 20, to present shows at 2 p.m. and 8 p.m.

The traditional 4-H coronation will be held on the fairgrounds outdoor stage at 6:45 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 18, and the 4-H Fashion Revue will be held Wednesday at 8 p.m.

Textile show scheduled for county fair

The textile exhibit will be on display throughout the five-day fair in the main fairgrounds pavilion.

Entries for the exhibit will be accepted Saturday and Sunday before the fair from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The various classes of competition will include baby articles, bedroom linens, textile painting, towels, table linens, quilts, rugs, afghans, pillows, aprons, sewing, stretch and sew, children's clothing, crocheted articles, machine knitting, hand knitting, hand weaving, hand spinning, toys, pictures and wall hangings, textile novelties, macrame, machine embroidery and miscellaneous categories.

There will also be special categories for handicapped person, exhibitors 70 years of age or older, juniors 16 and under and children 14 and under.
