Company opens limo service

A new transportation service, the Royal Highlander Ltd., has been formed with 24-hour limousine service and two vans that make three trips daily between Rhododendron, Gresham and Clackamas Town Center.

The firm, formed by Ray and Agnes Novotny, their daughter, Nancy Dougherty, and son R.J., and his wife, Linda, serves Rhododendron, Zigzag, Timberline Rim, Welches, Alder Creek, Brightwood, Zigzag Village, Sandy, Gresham and the

Clackamas Town Center. According to R.J., the secretary in charge of administration, the decision to start the transportation service was based on a market analysis conducted earlier this year, after he retired as a major from the U.S. Army.

He said transportation was selected from among a dozen things his family could do with their combined resources and fill a public need.

"We feel a specialness to the people here on the moun-

tain," he said. "We know what we have to offer is a good product. We now have to make the people realize we're dependable."

The Highlander's service differs from other transportation businesses that have opened on the mountain in that licensed chauffeurs can be depended on to pick up passengers at specific points and times.

Chamber moves meeting site

The Sandy Chamber of Commerce will hold its noon Tuesday meetings henceforth at Tollgate Inn, at the west end of town, and it's all due to a disagreement over food.

The Chamber voted unanimously Tuesday to move its weekly luncheon meetings from TJ's Fireside Dining to Tollgate Inn after a disagreement over the luncheon menu selection. Most civic and club meetings are held at TJ's.

Some Chamber members have complained in recent

meetings about the limited menu, and an ultimatum was carried to restaurant owners to either vary the selection or expect to lose the Chamber business.

"Apparently they (TJ's) do want us here, but not on our terms," Chamber Vice President Chuck Jones said of his ultimatum.

The restaurant was attempting to overcome a service problem recently when it abandoned any Chamber menu selection whatsoever, in favor of one featured hot plate at a price set just for Chamber members.

There had been a problem of many Chamber members not being served until late in the hour-long luncheon meeting.

Earlier the restaurant had offered a sandwich or hot plate special in a buffet line, but abandoned that practice to cut down on buffet line labor hired just for the Chamber meeting.

Ordering after members were seated presented subsequent service time problems.
