# High school announces registration

With school a month off, Sandy Union High School officials are gearing up for the arrival of students.

Next week, registration begins for juniors and seniors on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Aug. 10-12, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. each day. Freshmen and sophomores register the following week, Aug. 17-19,

from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. each day.

Students will have to be prepared with some information when they show up for registration. For the information sheet, students will need their current home address and phone number; both parent's place of work, work address and work phone number, and the fami-

ly doctor's name and phone number.

If a student wishes to participate in sports, they should bring money to buy insurance or have proof of insurance. The green Proof-of-Insurance sheet should be filled out and signed by a parent or legal guardian; the goldenrod Annual Interval History Form and Activities

Guidelines should be filled out and signed by a parent or legal guardian. The athletic towel fee, \$2 for one sport and \$5 for three sports, and a Student Body Card fee, \$5, should be paid.

Student body cards admit students to all home athletic events free of charge. Students must also have a student body card to attend dances. There is a \$2.50 replacement charge if a student should lose their card.

Other fees students should be aware of include the tex-

tbook deposit for all freshmen and new students to the district, \$12; P.E. towel fee, \$3; school accident insurance, \$11 for school-time insurance and \$28 for 24-hour coverage, and the yearbook, \$14.

Shop cards, \$5, need not be purchased until the instructor requests it.

The first day of school for freshmen only will be Sept. 8 and for all students, Sept. 9.

Yearbook pictures will be taken Sept. 16 for juniors, sophomores and freshmen.

# Schools get state funds

Public schools in Clackamas County will receive \$1,038,606.99 as part of a yearly distribution of funds by the State Land Board.

The distribution of state Common School Fund earnings to Oregon public schools for the year ending June 30, 1981, totals \$10.4 million, an increase of more than \$2 million from the amount distributed in 1980.

The board and Division of State Lands manage the \$100 million Common School

Trust Fund and other fund assets, including state-owned grazing, timber, and off-shore lands, coastal estuarine tidelands and submerged and submersible lands of Oregon's navigable waterways.

Proceeds from use of the lands and from other division activities, less division expenses, are placed in the fund's principal. Interest earned from the trust is paid annually to treasurers in each of Oregon's 36 counties, on the basis of school-age

population.

The current distribution totals almost \$16 for each of Clackamas County's 64,980 public school students.

Speaking for the Land Board, Gov. Vic Atiyeh, board chairman, said it was "pleased to see the fund's continued growth and its constant contribution to Oregon's school systems."

## Olaf Oja

Services for former lumber company operator Olaf Michael Oja, 78, of Portland were held Saturday. He died July 29 at a Clackamas hospital.

Born March 3, 1913, in Finland, he grew up in Minnesota. He married Violet I. Hulden in Minnesota on July 23, 1938. He was employed in logging in Minnesota and at a tool and die factory in Detroit.

Mr. Oja moved to Oregon in 1945 where he owned and operated Oja's Grocery. In 1948 he started Olaf M. Oja Lumber Co. in Sandy which he owned and operated for 30 years. He retired in 1978.

He is survived by his wife, Violet of Portland; a son, Mike of Sandy; two daughters, Kathy Janz of Oregon City and Nancy Hann of Silverton; a brother, Edwin of St. Claire Shores, Mich.; a sister, Helvi Kangas of Hibbing, Minn., and a grandson.

Private interment was at Lincoln Memorial Park in Portland. Memorials may be made to the Oregon Heart Association.

## Harriette Ellis

Former teacher Harriette Ellis, who spent 25 years teaching at Sandy Elementary School, died in Gresham July 28. She was 76.

She was born Harriette Ann Rucker in Keytesville, Mo., on Aug. 12, 1904. She was raised and educated in Missouri.

She married Lee Ellis in Arkansas on Nov. 29, 1929. He died in 1968.

She was a member of the Eastern Star and the Business and Professional Womens Club. She had lived in Gresham since 1969.

No public services were held. Interment was at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.

## Verne Redmon

Services for Sandy resident William Verne Redmon were held Tuesday in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Interment was at the Firhill Memorial Cemetery in Sandy.

He was born in Bantry, N.D., on Nov. 20, 1913. He died in a Portland hospital July 31. He was 67.
