Simple, elegant houses of stars

A television producer once rhapsodized about having his house designed to focus attention on his collection: He wanted one choice item to hang from the ceiling and another to be displayed in a large glass case in his dining room. What did he collect? Costly vintage automobiles.

Is such flair for the dramatic and offbeat the rule among the decors of show folks?

On the contrary, judging by a series of recent conversations.

Jamie Farr, who is Klinger on CBS's "M*A*S*H," and whose zany comedy flair livens up sequences in Burt Reynolds' movie "The Cannonball Run," opts for serenity at home. With his white rail fence, he says, his home "looks like Kentucky."

The house is actually in secluded Bell Canyon, near Los Angeles, where a gatekeeper guards the enclave. "But now that my wife, Joy, has spent about \$250,000 fixing the house the way we want it, we're going to move. We loved our visit to France, and we're building a French-provincial-style house, but still in Bell Canyon. It's great, coyotes and deer walk unmolested past our windows."

Stunning Bibi Besch, who has just finished filming "The Dorothy Stratten Story" (with Jamie Lee Curtis) due this fall on NBC, reports no coyotes at her windows, but plenty of serenity inside and out.

Even the most "colorful" room is gentle in tone. It is the pink and gray that Bibi's 10-year-old daughter chose for herself.

The house itself is something of a treasure, 60 years old, well-kept and "just east of Beverly Hills, with a good, well-integrated school nearby."

Yes, there is a pool in back. For the interior: pale colors and hanging plants. Asked to describe it in one word, Bibi says "Neat. I don't like clutter." A friend suggests another description: "What Bibi's house is, is elegant."

Also proud of owning a "new" old house (his was built in 1913) is Daniel J. Travanti who stars in "Hill Street Blues" as the tough, troubled and sexy police captain, Frank Furillo, in NBC's most

critically acclaimed series of last season.

Dan says, "Even before I knew the series was renewed I decided on it, figuring I could carry it for a year. And I'm renting out my old house." Instead of a vacation this summer, he stayed close to supervise the workmen, and things are so chummy they're all on a first-name basis.

Dan says that the small 1,600-foot house, which is near Marina Del Rey, will be perfect for his bachelor life after some spatial changes.

"But I'm keeping the architecture and the good hardwood floors." The red, white and green color scheme he's using was inspired by a tulip stained-glass window in the dining room. "And it works fine because I took along two couches from my old house that are covered in bottle green canvas."

Fannie Flagg, who co-stars with Barbara Eden on "Harper Valley P.T.A.," acquired some fine early American antiques when she bought a house in Scottsdale, Ariz., during the "New Dick Van Dyke Show," which was filmed at Dick's desert studio.

When the show folded, Fannie packed up her furniture and has now re-settled it in a large, lovely house in Santa Barbara, Calif. An invariable conversation piece is a free-form coffee table that, in earlier times, was a factory bellows.
