## Boring school reunion planned

A reunion of former Boring Grade School students, especially those who attended in the old building on Richey Road, will be held in the Naas Building on Sunday, Sept. 20, from 1 to 5 p.m.

The old building, a four-room school on Richey Road, was built in 1904, about the

same time that the interurban railroad to Boring was completed and the town began to take form.

During the 1920s and 1930s, the school had between 80 and 100 pupils and three teachers. The building was used until 1949.

The Richey Road school

replaced the original Boring school which had been built in 1883 on the J.W. Boring homestead on Kelso Road.

In the 1933 school picture are members of many prominent Boring families, some of which are Moore, Valberg, Irvin, Rich, Richey, Lake, Gantenbein,

Johnston, Marx, Knox, Carlin, Lekberg, Compton, Lang, Lindgren, Gregson, Lyons, Ledine, Eklund and Olson.

The principal and teacher is Errol Reese, who later was Multnomah County School superintendent for many years.

SANDY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 OPERATING "B" LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Sandy Union High School District levy \$255,846.03 outside of Oregon's Constitutional limitation for operating expenses during the fiscal year 1981-82?

PURPOSE: The purpose is to provide funds for continuing the educational program and needs adopted by the District for the students, grades nine through twelve.

EXPLANATION: This levy will fund the costs of continuing educational programs which are not eligible for funding under the "A" levy. It will also offset the loss of monies from the State of Oregon Basic School Support Fund. These monies are critical to the operation of your high school programs as approved by your Budget Committee.

If this measure is approved, \$255,846.03 of taxes levied will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial State payment. The estimated levy will be 53¢ per \$1,000.00 valuation.

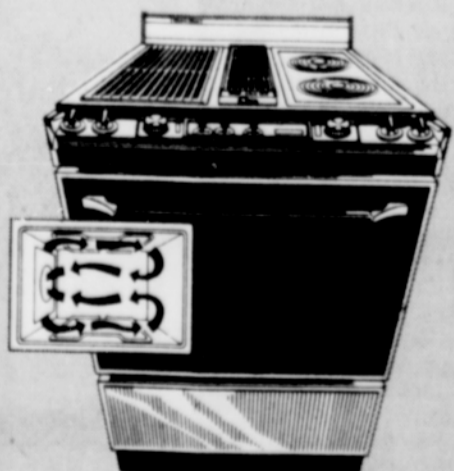
