Camp Fire volunteers are needed

During September the Mt. Hood Council will begin offering the Camp Fire programs at schools throughout Clackamas, Wasco, Sherman and Hood River Counties. In order to serve children in as many communities as possible, the organization is now seeking adult volunteers who could help organize clubs and serve as leaders.

Arlene Meehan, executive director, explained that Camp Fire offers growth opportunities to both children and adults. "Our club program emphasizes group planning and decision making and encourages youngsters to develop the skills necessary for successful living as adults."

"Adult volunteers grow in many ways too, though their association with Camp Fire. In addition to widening their horizons and making friends, many acquire self-confidence and learn new skill which are directly transferable to the job market," she said.

"At a time when government youth programs are being cut because of budgetary problems, self-supporting organizations such as Camp Fire, which operate without tax support, become of even greater importance to the community," Meehan concluded.

Camp Fire activities for children include crafts, outdoor camping and adventure, community service, educational experiences and outings, as well as events planned just for fun.

For first through third graders, there is the Blue Bird program. Adventure is for fourth through sixth graders, and the Discovery level serves youngsters in the seventh and eighth grades. Horizon Clubs provide leadership and service opportunities for students of high school age.

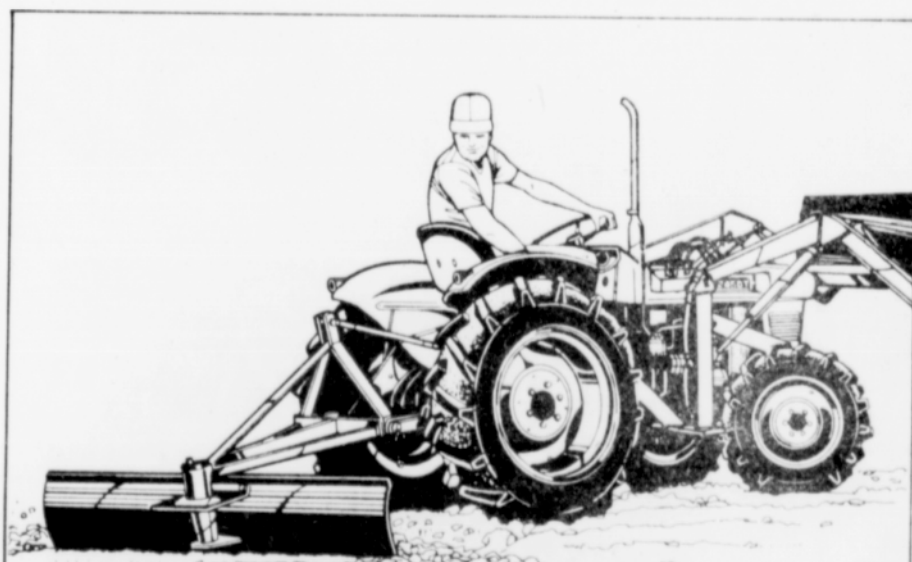
The portraits illustrate current trends in figurative art, including realism, expressionism, and primitivism.

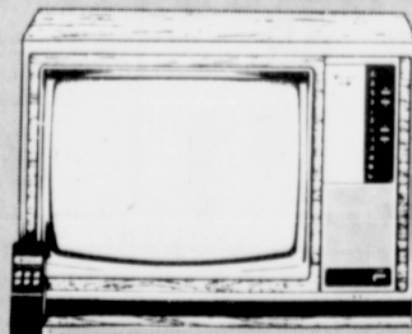
