## Medical calls dominate fire district's run sheet

Sandy Fire District officials are studying statistics based on alarms the district has responded to this year to see what areas they might work on to improve service.

During the first seven months of the year, 64 percent of the calls were related to the district's emergency medical services, according to Fire Marshal Jim Gallagher, and that means first-aid care is taking a high priority.

The district is talking now about additional training for the paid staff, he said Monday, and additional emergency medical in-service for the volunteer firefighters to sharpen their skills and learn some new ones.

Also in the discussion

phase is work with the emergency room at Gresham Community Hospital, whereby the district personnel could learn what they can do on the scene to make the hospital's work easier when the patient arrives there.

The hospital staff has told the district it provides excellent service, Gallagher said, and "we feel good about that."

In most cases the victim is stabilized on the scene to the point where the hospital can begin treatment immediately. "We still like to sharpen our skills," Gallagher said.

So far this year, he said, fires are "very down for us in our district." Through July, the district had responded to 70 fires: eight structure

fires, 12 vehicle fires, 23 chimney fires, 14 grass or rubbish fires and 13 fires in other categories.

The district assisted on 25 mutual aids with the Boring and Hoodland districts during that period.

Non-fire calls for the first seven months of the year totaled 355. They included 14 false alarms, 34 public assists, 192 first aids, 18 walk-in first aids, 20 calls on possible heart attacks and 77 vehicle accidents.

Last week the district responded to 24 alarms. They were 15 first aids, one car fire, five other fires, one automobile accident and three false alarms, including two malicious false alarms—a bomb threat and a report of a structure fire.
