PGE rate slash eases local billings

Rates for residential and farm customers of Portland General Electric Co. are going down an average of 27.5 percent on Oct. 1.

The rate decrease proposal is made possible because of a power exchange provision in the recently passed Regional Power Act. At the same time, PGE says it is instituting a new multi-tiered residential rate structure to encourage conservation.

PGE Sandy District Manager Bob Kallen said the proposed conservation rate recognizes the differences in use by season and between some customer groups.

"Our residential customers usually use more electricity in winter than in summer," he said. "Single family dwellings use more than multiple family dwellings."

PGE proposes to have multiple-family dwellings' winter and summer rates set at 2.5 cents per kilowatt hour for the first 300 kwh and 3 cents per kwh for the next 300. The winter rate would be 3.75 cents per kwh for usage between 601 and 1,500 kwhs. Summer rate would be 3.75 cents per kwh for usage between 601 and 800 kwh. Each

additional kwh above those amounts would be 4.5 cents.

Single-family dwellings would pay 2.5 cents per kwh for usage between 0 and 300 kwh and 3 cents for usage from 301 to 700 kwh in both summer and winter. In summer, single-family dwelling would pay 3.75 cents for each kwh between 701 and 1,300 kwhs. This rate would be extended to 2,300 kwhs in winter. Again, additional usage would be at 4.5 cents per kwh.

"We believe our customers in this area will be pleased with the proposed conservation rates," Kallen said.

PGE's present winter-summer rate is 4.52 cents per kwh. The \$3 monthly

customer charge is to remain.

Under the regional act, PGE will initially exchange with the Bonneville Power Administration an amount of energy to 60 percent of its residential and farm load.

BPA will buy the power from PGE at the utility's average system cost; the average cost of power from PGE generating and transmission facilities. In turn, BPA will sell PGE the same amount of power at the lower federal rate.

"The exchange agreement allows our customers to get their fair share of the lower cost federal power," PGE Board Chairman Robert Short said.

In addition to the rate

decrease announced by PGE, Short said the Regional Power Act provides for a regional conser-

vation effort and a coordinated approach to planning the Northwest's energy future.
