Blood drive falls short

The Kiwanis-sponsored blood drive received 58 donors at the Boring Fire Station.
While the drive fell short of the expected 100 donors, Bill Boring, a Kiwanis member and coordinator of the drive, said, "We are thankful for the ones that gave."
This was the largest drive for the Boring Kiwanis.
Tom King, Red Cross

blood services coordinator, attributes the shortcoming to the day the blood drive was held—Friday, the day before the weekend.
Blood drives are the source of operation for the Red Cross.
Each weekday 475 units of blood must be collected to meet the needs of the state of Oregon, in addition to 110 units on Saturdays, which are slower days for blood drives.

To meet these demands, blood drives are crucial.
Each donor that gives blood benefits four persons, according to King.
Blood can be separated into four usable parts. The Boring blood drive, therefore, took in enough blood to be used by 232 patients.
After each drive blood goes directly to a laboratory to be typed, and tested for acceptability.
It's checked and re-

checked, and then shipped to various hospitals where it is again screened.
Blood storage is an important process at the Red Cross. It may be refrigerated 45 days, and frozen for up to three years if necessary. But normally, it's used long before that time.
A drive, sponsored by the Hoodland Fire Department, is scheduled for Sept. 18, from 2-6 p.m. No appointment is necessary.

New lunch policy announced

Area schools last week announced their policies for free and reduced-price meals for children unable to pay full price for meals under the National School Lunch Program.
School officials have adopted the family-size income criteria for determining eligibility. Children whose family incomes are below the adopted levels

are eligible for free or reduced-price meals.
Applications are available at the school offices. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. Social Security numbers of all adult

members in the household are required on the application.
In certain cases, foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If families have foster children living with them and wish to apply for free or reduced-price meals for them, they should contact their school officials.
Under the provisions of

the policy, Superintendent Jean Lundy at Cottrell School, Superintendent Kenneth Blackburn at Welches School and the school principals in the Sandy Elementary School District, will review the applications and determine eligibility.
The policy carries an outline of the hearing procedure.

Construction has started on \$70,000 alpine slide

Construction has started on a \$70,000 Alpine Slide which will make Mt. Hood's Multitorpor Ski Bowl a summer, as well as winter, resort, according to Keith

Petrie, general manager of the Government Camp resort.
The development, which will open next summer, will have two side-by-side molded concrete tracks. The resort's lower ski bowl lift will carry passengers to the top of the tracks from where they will slide down in sled-like cars.

The development is a joint venture between Multitorpor, Inc. and the American Guaranty Financial Corp., which recently bought Bowman's Mt. Hood Golf Club and is developing the nearby Rippling River resort.
