Illegal burns plague Sandy fire department

Sandy fire district officials are concerned about the number of unauthorized burns and unattended burns occurring in the area while the weather is dry.

"We've got a pretty big problem with unauthorized burns, people burning on non-burn days and people not controlling the fire—lighting the match and walking away," Jim Gallagher, district fire marshal, said Tuesday.

He pointed to one fire in August as an example of what can happen with an unattended burn. A resident started a fire in a barrel during the morning and when

she returned, the fire had spread from the barrel and burned to within 10 feet of her home.

The result could have been disastrous, but Sandy firefighters were able to extinguish the blaze before further damage was done.

"It's very dry out," Gallagher said. "We're urging people to use extreme caution in the rural interface area. With the lack of moisture, there is a real serious potential for some dangerous land fires."

During the past week, the fire district responded to five grass, brush and rubbish fires; some of these fires were illegal. The district

also responded to two other fires—downed power lines on McCabe Road and in the Colorado Road area.

The district also answered eight first-aid calls, two alarms for minor vehicle accidents and two false alarms when smoke was reported in the area.

Two mutual aids were also listed on the weekly run sheet. One was another brush fire, this one in the Hoodland Fire District, and the second was an assist to the U.S. Forest Service on a fire near Hope Lake.

During August, the Sandy Fire District answered 93 alarms, bringing the 1981 total to 546 through Aug. 31.
