Mike's Bikes offers cyclists variety of services

Mike Silerian spent five years in his native Detroit, Mich., learning the ins and outs of bicycle repair in one of that city's largest bicycle shops.

He now offers his expertise at Mike's Bikes, three miles east of Sandy on Highway 26, the only bicycle shop east of Gresham on the way to Mt. Hood.

Silerian, 20, discovered the Sandy area on a vacation last year and with some of his friends decided to relocate. His move has been a plus for local cyclists, although they have been slow to discover his shop which opened in May, just before it rained for two solid weeks.

Silerian, who toured by bicycle in Michigan, said the cyclists in the Mt. Hood area have responded to his notices on public bulletin boards quite well, as well as the ride-in trade.

He's met a "rustic-looking fellow" from British Colum-

bia who stopped at the shop, located at the former site of Cy's Ski Repair, and visited, and a group of Englishmen touring the United States who spent the afternoon.

But mostly, Silerian is interested in meeting Sandy residents.

Currently, he handles minor tune-ups and repairs to bicycles and shares the expertise of other bike shops when a problem gets sticky. He can get parts within a couple days for those patient enough to wait for his services.

With the approach of winter, Silerian has announced new hours. He will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday, but urges cyclists to call him at any time if they have a problem or need some repairs. His telephone number is 668-8997.

Silerian said with the approach of winter, he is also willing to work at any odd jobs which might be available.

Post honored for excellence

The Sandy Post has won a first honorable mention award in a national newspaper evaluation contest for overall general excellence.

The contest, conducted by Newspaper Editorial Workshop Services of Florida, scored community newspapers on six judging categories with special emphasis on news coverage, editorial page and public service.

The Post scored what

amounts to fourth place nationally in overall general excellence with 58 earned points.

Hinsdale Doings in Illinois won the division with 72 points, while Post sister paper Cottage Grove Sentinel placed second with 65 points. Third place went to Orchard Park Suburban Press in New York with 60 points.

The Post competed with newspapers nearly twice as large in the judging.

Certificates were awarded to the top six newspapers in the contest. Ten newspapers competed in the division.

Points were awarded for high number of local stories and local editorials that take stands.

This marks the tenth year of the national contest.

Temporary plans on agenda

The Clackamas County hearings officer will consider a pair of temporary permit applications and a variance next Thursday, Sept. 17, affecting Sandy area properties.

The hearings will begin at 9 a.m. at the Department of Environmental Services, 902 Abernethy Road, Oregon City.

The first temporary per-

mit application would allow its proposer to use a mobile home as a temporary residence for a caretaker to take care of some bison and cattle on the west end of Kubitz Road.

The variance and temporary permit application hearing, scheduled for 9:40 a.m., would allow its proposer to place four six-square-foot signs on the pro-

perty for temporary seasonal use and to place two 30-square-foot permanent signs on the property.

The property is on the southwest side of Highway 26 at its intersection with 427th Avenue.

Copies of these two applications are available for inspection at the Department of Environmental Services.

Motorcycle safety class scheduled

A non-profit group is sponsoring a motorcycle safety course Saturday and Sunday for licensed riders who have their own bike.

The course, sponsored by the Four Seasons Motorcycle Rider School, will take place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. both days.

Teenagers under 18 years

of age will need their parents' permission to take the course. Other requirements include having proof of current motorcycle insurance, proper safety gear and adequate clothing.

The training involves three hours of classroom work and four hours on motorcycles the first day and two hours in class and

five hours on motorcycles the second day.
