Book review

Bergman memoirs offer rich life view

Ingrid Bergman is completely candid about her full life. Hers is a very absorbing autobiography, "Ingrid Bergman—My Story," assisted by Alan Burgess, BBC producer and author.

Bergman has appeared in 46 films, four television dramas and 10 stage plays. She has won three Oscars and was nominated for a fourth in "Autumn Sonata" in 1978. She has also received an Emmy for "The Turn of the Screw" in 1959.

Her love for the theater has cost her three husbands: Petter Lindstrom, Swedish surgeon (1937-49), Roberto Rossellini, Italian director

(1950-58) and Lars Schmidt, Swedish stage producer (1958-70).

While establishing her Hollywood career, she was with Petter for only one year during 1938-41. There was the war and he was busy furthering his own career. She was off doing films. He said, "No man ever gave his wife more freedom." She said, "I was always free away from him but not with him."

From 1943 to 1950, she did not spend more than three to six consecutive months in their new California home.

The public would not allow her career and her personal life to mix. In 1950, after leaving Petter and Pia, their daughter, to marry Rossellini, she from from

Number One at the box office to something close to box-office poison.

It's tough to be an idol; she had been so greatly loved and so much love can turn quickly to hate. Her stereotyped image, built up in "The Bells of St. Mary's," "For Whom the Bell Tolls" and "Joan of Arc" had been blackened. The public was outraged and the climate was one of hysteria.

Ingrid may have been emotionally drawn to Roberto because of her beloved father. He had been an unconventional painter and photographer, and Rossellini had much the same spirit. In any case, he was the exact opposite of the highly principled and self-controlled Lindstrom.

The marriage produced a son and twin girls, but little else. The golden oil of Italy and the pure snow-water of Sweden refused to mix commercially. She was well on her way to oblivion when, in 1957, she appeared in Jean Renoir's film, "Paris Does Strange Things." This was followed by "Anastasia" and an Oscar.

Anatole Litvak had refused to direct it for 20th Century-Fox unless Ingrid played it. America "forgave" her, but her marriage to Rossellini was in ruins.

She is not a natural linguist, but she speaks Swedish, German, English, French and Italian. When she arrived in New York in 1938, she had an understanding of English. In Sweden, she had taken lessons from a language teacher from England, but American English was very different. While she was in New York, she decided to learn "American" by going to plays.
