

NNA honors Post cartoonist

A Sandy High junior has earned the Sandy Post a national award for one of the best original cartoons in an American weekly newspaper.

Roman Scott, 16, part-time Post cartoonist the past two years, captured third-place honors in National Newspaper Association's Better Newspaper Contest.

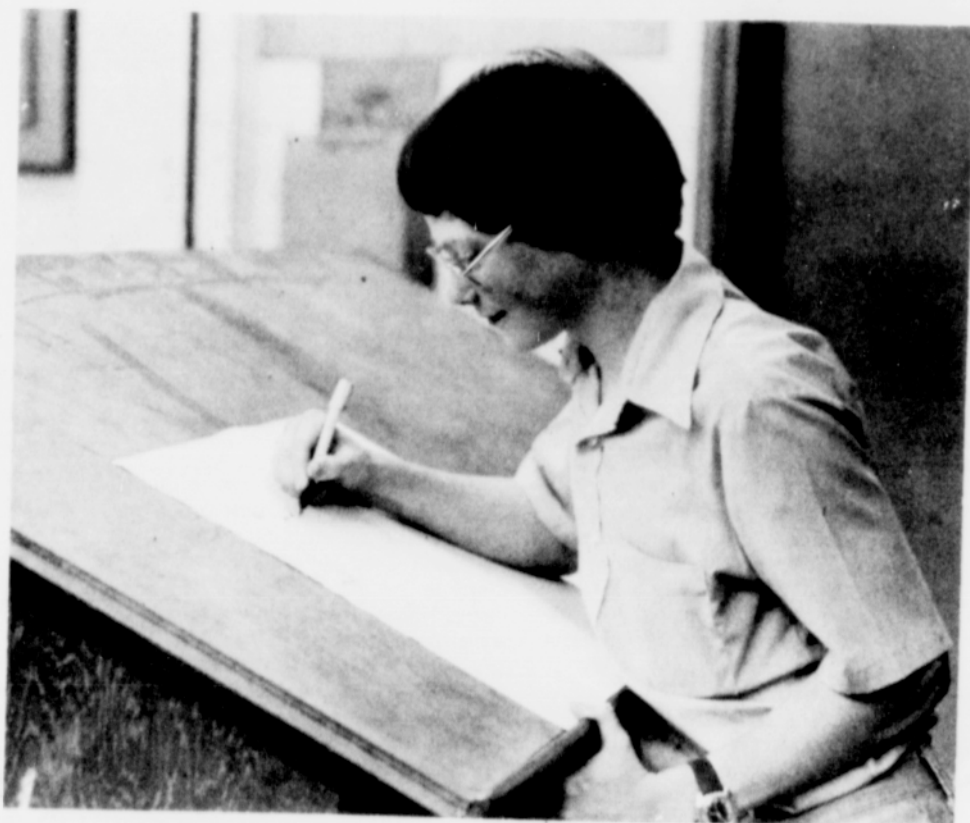
Competition in the original cartoon category includes American weekly newspapers of all sizes. Some entries were from community newspapers with more than 10,000 circulation—many times larger than The Post.

The Post's cartoonist is the son of Walt and Jackie Scott of Sandy. He said he gets many ideas for local editorial cartoons from his mother, who serves as correspondent for The Oregonian.

His winning cartoon depicted Ronald Reagan during his campaign as an elderly politician with missiles flying out of a pompadour hairdo.

This marks the second consecutive year The Post has won a national award in the NNA Better Newspaper Contest, one of the most prestigious and popular national competitions.

Bull Run School sets free-lunch policies

Bull Run School District No. 45 this week announced its policy for free and reduced-price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals under the National School Lunch program.

Children from families whose income is at or below the adopted levels are eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

Application forms are available at the school office and may be submitted at any time during the year.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If families have foster children living with them and wish to apply for such meals for them, they should contact the school.

Under the provisions of the policy, Robert Fones will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with his ruling and wishes to make a formal appeal, he may make a request either orally or in writing to the hearing official, Jack Layton, 43754 S.E. Phelps Road, 668-5941, for a hearing to appeal the decision. The policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a family member becomes unemployed or if the family size changes, the

family should file a new application. Such changes may affect the eligibility of the children.

A copy of the complete policy is available at the school principal's office which may be reviewed by any interested party.

Illegal burn nets man court date

A Sandy man was cited this week as the result of burning illegal materials on a day which the Environmental Protection Agency had not designated for outdoor burning.

Sandy Fire Chief Bob Rathke cited Darwin Delaney Buswell, 29, of Sandy into Clackamas County District Court Sunday, Sept. 13, for burning prohibited materials—tires—and burning on a non-burn day.

Last Thursday, personnel at Hildebrand North America told Sandy police that someone had taken a television, typewriter and toaster oven from the firm's Industrial Park location. Value of the merchandise was approximately \$175.

A 17-year-old Sandy youth was cited last Thursday for careless driving after the car he was driving struck a utility pole of North Bluff Road near the Sandy High School athletic field. No one was injured in the incident. Aristeo Remigo Martinez,

23, of Culver was cited Friday for driving with a suspended license.
