Variety of fires battled during week

The Sandy Fire District responded to four fire alarms this past week — each representing a different type of blaze.

Thursday, firefighters answered a call from a residence at 37115 S.E. Kelso Road on a motorcycle fire.

A young man had tied his motorcycle to a tree and was revving it up while spinning the tires, overheating the engine. When he turned it off, the small dirt bike burst into flames.

According to Fire Marshal Jim Gallagher, a possible gas leak or a gas line the overheated engine melted caused the fire. The loss was

estimated at \$150-\$200.

Sandy firefighters responded to an alarm Friday at 35352 S.E. Hauglum Road. A cigarette dropped in an overstuffed chair caused \$25 damage to the contents of a home owned by Nicholls Curtis, according to Gallagher.

District personnel also responded to a car fire in the parking lot of Cejka's Hardware Friday afternoon. A 1968 Chevrolet, owned by W.E. Craft of Sandy, sustained minor damage when a leak in the carburetor caused gasoline to drip on to the vehicle's manifold.

Saturday, firefighters responded to a mobile home fire at 9:30 a.m. at 44885

Kleinsmith Road. The residence is owned by John Hopkins.

The fire started in the bedroom, according to Gallagher, and starved for a lack of oxygen. Gallagher estimated that the fire had smoldered for about 30 minutes before it was discovered by an off-duty Multnomah County Fire District 10 firefighter on his way home. The Hopkins had left the home at approximately 9 a.m.

The fire marshal estimated the total burn time of the fire at 40 minutes.

He said the structure was valued at approximately \$10,000 and sustained \$5,000

damage. Contents of the mobile home were valued at \$5,000 and sustained \$3,000

damage. The fire is under investigation.
