Sandy sports summary

SUHS coach glad to see lower times

Coach Scott McMullen couldn't have asked for much more out of his cross country team last Friday at the Invitational they hosted. He said, "Every single runner, that ran (for SUHS) last year, had a personal record in time, as well as a personal record on our course."

"Everybody PRed." Sophomore Sam Romey's 15:56 timing in the 5,000 meters put him third on the all-time list for the Sandy course. His best time as a freshman was 17:35.

Ken Urban currently is number two on that all-time list, with a time of 15:51. Urban ran that in 1978.

Romey only needs to take nine seconds off his time to take over the number one spot, held by Fred Spool of Astoria, who ran the course in 15:47 in '78.

Romey, by the way, was knocking off the miles at a 5.28 clip for that first-place finish. 5,000 meters is roughly 3.1 miles.

Phil Burks got his time down from 18:10 last year to 16:53 Friday. Brian Reick went from 18:57 last year to 17:20. Brian Buhler got his time down to 17:31 from 17:51. Brent Plaster, who wasn't out last year, ran the course in 20:20.

The boys won the triangular meet. Sharon Jensen was the only Sandy runner in the varsity girls division. She turned in a 12:14 performance on

the 3,000-meter course, which was good enough for a second-place finish. Her best time last year was 12:40.

A number of varsity girls didn't run because they hadn't completed enough practice days before the meet, which was the team's first.

The junior varsity girls fell to Lincoln in a duel matchup Friday.

Runners, places and times for Sandy in that 2,000-meter run are Patty Groombridge, 4th, 8:31; Petra Beissmann, 5th, 8:32; Susan Krick, 6th, 8:44; Crystal Calkins, 7th, 9:01; and Kelly Douglas, 11th, 9:52.

Friday the Pioneers will compete in the Timber Valley League Invitational at Oregon City. All the teams in Sandy's district will be competing.

Volleyball team falls

guarantee any hunts will be held, and no way of knowing where they will be if any are conducted.

Any Oregon resident 18 years of age or older is eligi-

ble to apply. A hunting license is not necessary to apply for an emergency hunt list, but the hunter is expected to buy one before participating in any hunts that

might be called.

Application is made by postcard or letter. The words "EMERGENCY HUNT" should appear at the top. The card should list the applicant's name, address, a telephone number where the applicant can be contacted during daytime hours or where a message can be left, and the name of one county where the applicant would be willing to hunt if needed. Only one card will be accepted per person, but several persons can staple their cards together, in effect applying as a party.

Applications should be sent to the headquarters office of the Department of Fish and Wildlife, Box 3503, Portland, Ore. 97208. Lists being compiled now will be valid through June 30, 1982.

Names will be listed by county in the order received and will be on file at department headquarters. If a hunt is called, individuals on the list for the appropriate coun-

ty will be notified by telephone or mail and given instructions on time and place to check in for the hunt. A permit will be issued at check-in time and a permit fee collected.

On Thursday, July 23, Fish Division staff with the Department of Fish and Wildlife will present management proposals for six Oregon waters — three streams, one lake and two reservoirs — to the Fish and Wildlife Commission. The management plan review will begin at 1 p.m. in the conference room at department headquarters, 506 SW Mill Street in Portland.

The management plans are part of an effort that will eventually see written management objectives for all the state's major lakes, streams and reservoirs. In the process of writing the plans, each water is evaluated under a wild fish policy adopted by the Fish and Wildlife Commission in

1978. There are three options under the policy. First, the option to manage for wild fish exclusively must be considered. Next, if there are reasons why optimum fish populations cannot be maintained under natural production alone, the staff may recommend the use of some hatchery fish in addition to wild stocks. In this option, efforts must still be made to preserve the genetic integrity of wild stocks. A final option under the policy is to manage for hatchery fish only.

The plans that will be considered at the meeting cover the following waters: Sycan

River, Metolius River, Honey Creek (near Hart Lake in Lake County), Ana Reservoir (near Summer Lake), Lookout Point Reservoir (near Oakridge), and Klamath Lake.

The management proposals call for Honey Creek, Sycan River and Klamath Lake to be managed with wild trout only; the Metolius River for wild and hatchery trout; and Ana and Lookout Point Reservoirs to receive white bass-striped bass hybrids. The hybrids may provide a good control for the rough fish populations in these waters and in addition are a good game fish.
