Brewster enjoying year in Argentina

A Sandy High School junior is spending the school year living in Moron, Argentina, as part of a unique exchange program.

Alex Brewster was selected by the Gresham Rotary Club to be its international exchange student from Rotary district 510, which encompasses the area surrounding Sandy.

He will spend a full year in the South American country attending school and living with three families.

District 510 of the Rotary Club chooses approximately 35 students from Oregon and southern Washington to live and study in 20 different countries around the world.

The students are trained, spending several weeks together undergoing evaluations for their ability to

represent the Rotary Club and the free enterprise system of business.

This summer Brewster joined other participants for a week at Anthony Lakes,

the state Rotary convention and a camping trip at the beach along the Oregon Coast.

During the trips they were evaluated for their ability to get along with people, meet and make friends, and good judgement when given freedoms in new situations.

The Rotary Club has one of the most extensive exchange programs on the teenage level, as well as for graduate studies abroad and young businessmen.

The group is involved with cooperative programs with Rotary Clubs around the world in the areas of human understanding and humanitarianism.

As the sponsoring club, Rotary pays most of the ex-

penses of the exchange student. The club also hosts an exchange student for one year in the Gresham area.

The students study during

their high school junior year and are expected to return to their school and community, representing the culture of the country they visited.

Federal funds aid county

Clackamas County offers richer thanks to two recent payments from the federal government.

Clackamas is one of 18 western Oregon counties which will divide more than \$83 million as its share of timber sale receipts from the Oregon and California Railroad (O&C) revested lands during the last 11-month period.

Secretary of Interior James Watt has announced that the U.S. government will also pay more than \$2.7 million to 34 Oregon counties to compensate partially for federal lands within their boundaries that were tax exempt during fiscal year 1981.

The Clackamas County O&C funds total \$4,658,180.77.

The county's share of in-lieu of taxes payment is \$51,105.

The share of the O&C funds is based on the 1916 value of O&C land in Clackamas County compared with the total O&C valuation in that year. When the O&C railroad failed to live up to requirements of its railroad construction land grant, the federal government repossessed the land in 1916.

Under the 1937 O&C Act, the land is managed for sustained timber yield, and other multiple uses. Counties

with such lands receive half of the gross revenues from timber sales while 25 percent is returned to the Bureau of Land Management for investment in land management.

The in-lieu of taxes payments supplement revenues the federal government regularly shares with local governments from the sales of resources harvested from the public lands.
