# Rehearsals begun for play

Sandy High School's production of "West Side Story" doesn't open until Nov. 13, but a large group of students are rehearsing more than 12 hours a week for the show already so that when it takes the stage at the Community Theater everything will go off without a hitch.

And the difficulty of the musical makes that a challenge.

"We may have bitten off more than we can chew," Director Mark Kuntz said this week. Nevertheless, by the time the audience settles into its seats in November, he is confident it will see a quality performance.

"The music is probably the most difficult part of it," Kuntz said. Leonard Bernstein wrote the songs and "it's a very challenging piece for the orchestra."

The high school will feature a full orchestra for

only the second time; the first performance with orchestra was last spring's "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum."

"They're rehearsing right now also," Kuntz said, "and it's a much longer period of rehearsal for them." The orchestra is directed by Steve Christensen.

Kuntz cast the play last spring. "For some high schools it's unusual, but I like to do it," he said. "The kids get a chance to settle down over the summer."

At a cast picnic at Wildwood Park in August, scripts were handed out and measurements taken for costumes. Lynn Daugherty is designing the costumes.

The sets, featuring nine different scenes, were designed by Kuntz. He said, as a result, the stage will offer "a lot of movement."

The set will revolve around the middle of the stage using pivoting scaf-

folding. All scene changes are designed so as actors leave the stage, they pull the scaffolding with them and the stage opens on a new scene with its actors already in place.

"It's a massive set," Kuntz said. "With all the bodies on it, it's going to be a nice atmosphere for the audience."

Tuesday evening this week, the production crew had a set-building party, he

said. "We're well on our way to building the sets."

And Kuntz promises, the SUHS production will be different than the classical story of gangs in New York.

"It'll be more human," he said. "We're going to make the first scene (a rumble) as ugly and nasty as we can."

Tickets will go on sale for the production during the third week of October at the high school.

## Merit scholars announced by SUHS principal

Sandy High School Principal John McMahan this week announced the names of three seniors who are being commended in the 27th annual National Merit Scholarship Program.

Letters of Commendation will be presented to Teresa Bolterman, Amy Craig and Nancy McCoy, who placed among the top 51,000 participants in the current competition.

Of some 1.2 million students who entered the 1982 Merit Scholarship competition by taking a qualifying test in 1980, about 36,000 are being commended this month, as the begin their final year of high school.

The Sandy participants scored high, but slightly below other Oregon students who qualified as Merit Program semifinalists.

Only the 15,000 semifinalists, who were announced Sept. 16, will receive further consideration for Merit Scholarships. In the spring of 1982, 5,000 Merit Scholarship winners will be announced. They will receive awards worth \$15 million for college undergraduate study.
