

Former local escapes yacht as it sinks

Bill Shockey, a former Sandy Union High School student, and his wife, Pat, lost nearly all their possessions Monday when their "yacht-type of boat" sunk off Cape Cod, Mass.

Alice Shockey of Cherryville said Tuesday that her son and his wife had been living in Florida, but traveled to Massachusetts because a friend there helped them work on their boat.

They were on their way back to Florida when the boat started sinking. The Coast Guard rescued them.

Mrs. Shockey said that the details are sketchy. She said that they are flying back to this area soon, and that they lost everything that they had, except that they managed to rescue their "little dog."

Raymond Lindsey

Funeral services for Sandy resident Ramond E. Lindsey were held Sept. 25 in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. He died at his home Sept. 21 at the age of 58.

Mr. Lindsey was born Dec. 23, 1922, in Bismark, Mo. When he was nine, his family moved to Colorado. While attending high school, he worked to help support his mother and family.
