Pioneer soccer team gets a key league win

The Pioneer soccer team got a key league win Friday, defeating Oregon City 1-0 in an away game.

"It was the best soccer game I've experienced at Sandy Union High School," said Coach Lon Welsh.

Everyone on the team played at or above their potential the entire game, he said.

The win puts them in a tie for second in the league with Glencoe. Both have 3-1 records.

Lakeridge and Lake Oswego, two ranked teams, are tied for first in the league.

Joel Dose scored the goal for the Pioneers, with the assist by Alan Burchfield. Dose scored it in the first 20 seconds of the game, on the opening kickoff play.

In the first half the Pioneers stuck primarily to defense, taking four shots at the goal while Oregon City got nine shots off.

In the second half they got things turned around, taking 12 shots to three for Oregon City.

One important reason for the win, according to Welsh, was the play of "standout midfielder" Peter Schmautz, a junior.

"He was everywhere," Welsh said.

Times for the varsity girls and boys cross country teams were lowered across the board again Friday in a triangular at Mollala.

The boys downed Mollala 21-36, but fell 33-22 to Oregon City.

The girls won 25-30 over Oregon City, and won over an incomplete Mollala team.

The top four girls did an especially good job of getting their times down, said Coach Scott McMullen.

He said that they went out a little faster than usual Friday, which is probably why they ended up seeing all the times go down for another week.

Sam Romey ran the 3,000 meters in 15:57, which translates into 5:08 miles.

At that speed, on the Sandy course, he "would have just topped all records here," McMullen said.

He'll get that chance Thursday, when the Pioneers host Canby and Estacada in a triangular at 4 p.m.

The girls won without their top runner, Donna Nelson, who was ill.

Tough teams in tournament

The SUHS volleyball team took third, unofficially, in a volleyball tournament here this weekend.

The competition was stiff. St. Mary's, the second-ranked team in AAA, finished first, while Barlow, the third-ranked team in AAA, took second.

Also competing was Bend, one of the better teams in the state, according to Coach Ron Grantz, and Clackamas, described as a .500 Wilco League team, and La Salle.

"They've got one of the top three or four programs around," Grantz said of La

Salle. "They seem to be beating everybody in the double As. I think they're going to win the AA Championship."

The girls took a fairly handy two-game win Thursday night against West Linn into the Saturday tournament.

They started out the round robin seeding tournament with a two-game win over Clackamas.

"It went pretty well," Grantz said. "It's really tough to get motivated about playing volleyball at 8:30 in

the morning."

They lost their first game to La Salle, with Grantz substituting freely, then won the second game.

Grantz pointed out that since the tournament didn't affect league records, and hence the state playoffs, that the coaches could, and did, use the opportunity to play a lot of people.

He was disappointed with their play against St. Mary's. "We didn't pass well against them, and they just did everything right," he

said.

"That's why they're one of the best teams in the state, because they're not making mistakes."

Grantz said that they're capable of beating any team in the state on a good day, but said that they've got to be mentally ready if they're going to be able to do it.

A game wasn't held for third, but Sandy was third in the seeding from the round robin.

Grantz said that they've got a couple of tough weeks coming up. He said that

physically they're capable of doing the job.

"Skill-wise we have made some real improvements," he said. "Some people are really hitting the ball." Like Dawn New, Julie Coleman, Paige Daugherty and Stephanie Hagstrom, he said.

He said that they've got to get it together mentally. "If we go out aggressively, and are determined to go after some people, we will be tougher than nails."

The girls downed Canby 15-8 and 15-11 Tuesday night.
