'Moonlight Madness' set; activities begin Friday

Things are brewing in Sandy for a spooky Halloween celebration.

The city-wide events Friday, Oct. 30, (day before trick-or-treating) are sponsored by Sandy Area Merchants.

The local retailers will host fun activities for kids and families as special attraction for their annual "Moonlight Madness" sale also Oct. 30 from 7 until 10 p.m.

Special Halloween events include a haunted house downtown, horse-drawn hayrides to Meinig Park for marshmallow roasts, a kids costume party and in-store high jinks.

Shopkeepers also will dress in spooky costumes for the occasion.

Big spotlights downtown will point out the fun spots that Friday in Sandy.

The spook house above Sandy DeCor Center at the corner of Proctor and Meinig actually will operate Thursday through Saturday, Oct. 29, 30 and 31. Hours those nights will be 6-11 p.m.

The "Skin Flins," a group organized by Moonlight Madness coordinator Jan Fox of Sandy DeCor, is sponsoring the Haunted House. A nominal admission fee will be charged.

Hayrides from the drug store area downtown to

Meinig Park will be driven by youth from Sandy High Future Farmers of America club.

Rides will leave every 15 minutes, 6:30-9 p.m. on Oct. 30. Departure point will be the grassy lot area between Sandy Rexall Drug and Benj Franklin.

Participants will be treated to a marshmallow roast in the upper lot of Meinig Park. Rides back from the park may be taken anytime during the night, with a pony-driven wagon and another tractor-pulled wagon making 15-minute shuttles.

Kids who like to dress up in spooky costumes can win prizes for showing up that night, too.

Sandy Area Merchants

will award prizes to the first 30 contestants at a costume contest 6:30 p.m., Oct. 30, in the parking lot of Heritage Square.

Costumed youngsters from 4 to 14 years old also will compete for cash prizes of \$50, \$35, \$25, \$15 and \$10.

Head judge is Dr. Jack Peters, Sandy High School District superintendent.

Many Sandy stores that participate in the SAM-sponsored Moonlight Madness sale 7-10 p.m., Oct. 30, will feature in-store activities, refreshments and other attractions.

The object of all the high-jinks is to provide an old-fashioned town celebration for the whole family, explained SAM coordinator Jan Fox.
