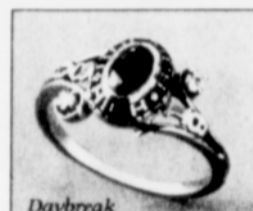

## BPA seeks input on proposed service



The Bonneville Power Administration has scheduled a public "scoping" meeting this Monday, Oct. 26, at 7:30 p.m. at Kelso School on environmental issues surrounding a new 500,000-volt transmission line proposed for service in the Longview-Portland area by 1988.

Five plans are now under consideration, four of them involving further development of existing powerline corridors, including the cor-

ridor just west of Sandy. The plans include possible routes on both sides of the Columbia River, with river crossings on in several alternatives.

BPA began planning for the project in 1979 with a draft environmental impact statement describing two possible routes. Reassessment of the project has resulted in the several more potential routes.

Printed informational

materials on the proposed project will be available at the scoping meeting.

"These scoping meetings will provide opportunities for the public and local governments to learn about our plans," said George Gwinnett, BPA's Lower Columbia Area manager. "The meetings will also give us some direction for the public as we begin our environmental analysis."

## SUHS play tickets here
