The Rev. Eugene Ness, missionary evangelist for the Assemblies of God, will be guest speaker for a conference on the Holy Spirit beginning this Sunday, Nov. 8.

The work of a missionary evangelist is not new to the Nesses. They have traveled extensively in past years ministering in Fiji, Indonesia, Germany, Italy, Greece and Mexico. The focus of their ministry will be to conduct crusades, tent meetings, stadium meetings and national minister institutes.

Prior to missionary appointment, the Nesses pastored prominent churches in California and Oregon. His civic interests as a pastor led him to serve as president of the ministerial association in Fairfield, Calif., and as chaplain of the Solano County Sheriff's Department.

Ness received a bachelor's degree from Northwest College of the Assemblies of God in Kirkland, Wash. He received graduate degrees from Golden State University in Los Angeles.
