

Three barriers are bound for state

Sandy sophomore Sam Romey "tore 'em up at the end" to win first place in the Timber Valley League-District Cross Country Meet Tuesday at Oregon City.

Romey let loose for with a good kick at the end, according to Coach Scott McMullen, easily clinching the top spot with a 16:01 finish on the 5,000-meter course.

Another Pioneer sophomore also qualified for state. Sharon Jensen was "just outstanding," said McMullen. She took second with a time of 11:07

on the 3,000-meter course. Senior Darby Binder will also be going to state. Her "super effort" earned her a fifth-place finish with an 11:23 time.

McMullen was disappointed that the entire girls team didn't qualify for state, but that displeasure was offset somewhat by the fact that the boys team went from near-cellar dwellers last year to third place Tuesday.

The top six individuals make the trip to state. The top two teams also qualify. The Sandy girls, like the boys, finished third.
