

Goal of meeting is formation of a planning organization

A public meeting, to be held for the purpose of forming a Citizens Planning Organization (CPO) for the Mt. Hood Corridor, will be held Dec. 3 in the gym at Welches Grade School at 7:30 p.m.

The organizational meeting is being held at the request of the Clackamas

County Board of Commissioners, who rejected the Environmental Committee on Suitability (ECOS) as a CPO on Oct. 29.

At that hearing Commissioner Ralph Groener told ECOS representative Carolyn Smith of Rhododendron that her organization did not pro-

vide adequate notice to property owners that a CPO was being formed.

Smith said that they had done everything as specified by the county for the formation of the CPO including notification. She said that they posted notices within the boundaries, in post offices as

well as on community bulletin boards. In addition, they posted public hearing notices in two newspapers circulated in the area.

Groener said that he doesn't pay any attention to those types of notices, and moved that the county pay for a mailing to announce a

meeting to discuss the formation of the CPO.

He said the mailing would go directly to all property owners within the boundaries identified by ECOS, which would be Zigzag west to Wildcat Creek, and bordered by the National Forest on the north and south.

Marilyn Leslie of Zigzag, who is secretary-treasurer of ECOS, said that the county had not gone far enough to insure that residents who do not own property are notified. She said that a bulk mailing to everyone concerned, both residents and property owners, would have been

more efficient.

Smith said that she attempted to get the county to do a bulk mailing but

that this was denied by Ardis Stevenson, the assistant director of Environmental Services.
