The public is invited to the annual Christmas Open House at the Damascus Pioneer Crafts School on Sunday, Dec. 13, from 1 to 5 p.m.

Also celebrated that day will be the new status of the schoolhouse, now listed in the National Registry of Historic Buildings.

Registration for winter term classes is now open. In addition to the usual

classes in spinning, weaving, stitchery, and knitting, featured workshops include pine needle or reed basketry, American Indian fingerweaving, Mexican backstrap weaving, English smocking, Kimono construction, and ancient and present-day dyepot methods.

The school is located at 14711 SE Anderson Road, in Damascus.

Chairman elected to advisory council

Vern Jones, an administrator with Edgfield Manor Multnomah County Nursing Home in Troutdale, was recently elected chairman of the Mt. Hood Community College vocational-technical education advisory council.

The 14-member council was formed by the college several years ago to lend outside advice to the college in development and maintenance of its vocational-technical program curriculum.

"Technical advances continually change the requirements for adequate job performance, and community colleges must keep current with these changes," Jones said.

He said the council can help provide a sharper definition of the college district's overall vocational-technical needs. This in turn aids the individual advisory committees in guiding the college's

67 vo-tech programs.

Dr. Jack Miller, MHCC's dean of instruction, added that the council also advises the college on the use of federal and state funds available for vocational-technical education.

"And because the council members are business people from the college's district reflecting business, industry, labor, health and other occupational areas, they help us in two ways. They not only provide input in vocational-technical educational matters but they also serve as spokesmen for the college to members of the community about the college's programs," Miller said.

Veterans Center aids return to education

The Veterans Education Center of Oregon is an organization designed to assist undereducated veterans in their return to education.

VECO is located at the Maywood Park Center of Mt. Hood Community College at 10100 NE Prescott.

The VECO program will aid veterans who do not have a diploma or an equivalency certificate to receive a high school

diploma through MHCC or a certificate through the G.E.D. testing program.

VECO will also help the student with those initial documents to enroll in a degree, certificate or apprenticeship program.

The center offers classes in the basic skills of reading, mathematics and English, and supplemental skills such as the sciences, social studies and career education.
