Agreement simplifies building OK's

County commissioners and about 15 fire districts in Clackamas County have made an agreement that may help builders of commercial and public buildings.

The county and fire officials have agreed to let county building plan inspectors conduct plan reviews normally done by inspectors in the State Fire Marshal's office.

However, before the workload is switched to the county, the state must approve the proposal.

The agreements were made as part of the application process for a partial exemption from the state law that requires the fire marshal review of plans.

Currently builders of commercial or public structures must submit plans to both county and state agencies for review. The county looks for structural and code compliance, while the state examines plans for fire hazards and safety codes.

"There is some duplication that would be eliminated," said Dick Dopp, county development

services director. His department includes the county plan reviewers.

"It will benefit the builders and the fire districts," he said. "No longer will the public have to travel to Salem to take plans in and to answer questions." If the change is approved, builders would save the cost of submitting a copy of its building plan to the state.

Dopp also said fire districts would be able to provide more input because reviews would be done closer to fire district offices.

"In fact, it may allow better fire protection before the buildings are built," Dopp said.

He explained that now districts tailor their equipment and training to existing buildings—which vary greatly. With a local review, the buildings would be reviewed with the fire district facilities and manpower in mind.

Another advantage is that the county would get a larger fee because the reviewers would be doing more work.

The county reduced its development services divi-

sion staff's work week to four days at the beginning of October because construction was down. Department operations are funded through fees for plan review and building permits.
