Directory features consumer news

A 32-page Fact Finder Section has been added to the new GTE telephone book for the Sandy area. The new directory now is in the process of being delivered. The cover pictures a lake scene at sunset. The Fact Finder Section, located in front of the directory, is printed on white paper with blue and black ink colors. The Sandy directory is the second annual directory distributed to all customers in General Telephone of the Northwest's five-state territory to contain this new section.

"This new section includes traditional data such as area codes, long distance rates and customer information about General Telephone," said Chuck Day, division manager for GTE. "However, the Fact Finder's uniqueness lies in the useful consumer information it contains." The consumer-oriented contents include a U.S. interstate highway map, regional driving distances and times, household hints, a three-page section on energy conservation, a metric conversion chart, interest rates and salary

computations, a medical records form, special dates and three-year calendar, monthly personal calendars for 1982 and postal mailing information. Another feature in the new telephone book is the 16-page Blue Section which immediately follows the Fact Finder. The color-coded Blue Pages, introduced last year, includes the Guide to Human Services; listings of city, county, state and U.S. government offices; public schools; Tri-Met bus service information, and zip codes.

The directory also spotlights the "911" emergency telephone number inside the front cover. However, there is one exception in using the "911" number for General Telephone customers with a 663 prefix. These customers live in either Multnomah or Clackamas County. Because of the county boundary lines, 663 customers should continue to use seven-digit numbers for emergency services. These seven-digit numbers are also highlighted inside the front cover, Day said.

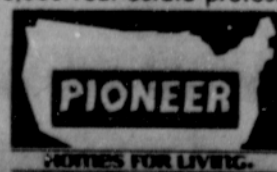
