Library notes

New book traces roots of Oregon

Fans of Oregon history will undoubtedly be interested in "Eden Seekers: the Settlement of Oregon, 1818-1862," by Malcolm Clark.

As a distinguished writer on the history of the Pacific Northwest, his articles have appeared in numerous publications.

"Eden Seekers" tells the story of the settlement of the Oregon territory by

frontier Americans who considered this state their Eden.

Clark would have readers put from their minds the pioneer of legend and consider who and what these people actually were—an imperfect lot, seldom unselfish and often unwashed. Yet the built farms and cities and made Oregon a state.

The author explores many colorful and in-

teresting details based almost exclusively on primary sources. This account should have something new for even the veteran Oregon historian.

Other new books at the Sandy Public Library include "The Other Side of Thirty" by Victoria Pellegrini, "Kicking the Fear Habit" by Manuel

Smith, Ph.D., and "Ride Down the Wind" by Wayne Barton.

New juvenile books at the library include "The Surfer and the City Girl" by Betty Cavana, "The Great Brain Reforms" by John Fitzgerald, and "A Swiftly Tilting Planet" by Madeleine L'Engle.
