

## Bench the key in 64-40 win over Spectrum

The Pioneers came alive in the second half against Spectrum, Victoria, British Columbia, scoring 42 points for a 64-40 win. They had a slow start, having led

only once in the first half. They were behind 24-22 at halftime. After a team meeting at halftime the Pioneers came to a conclusion. "We decided to rebound. That's

the key," said senior Bob Nippert. "We didn't have many rebounds the first half."

Although Nippert had 18 points, 12 rebounds, seven steals and a blocked shot, it was teammate Marvin Schaffer, a 5-8 senior, that stole the show Saturday.

He had 14 points, six rebounds, five steals and four assists against the Canadians.

"I was real pleased with Marvin Schaffer," Coach Dan Brisbin said. "He came off the bench and gave us a lift when we were down."

Starter Troy Wolf, a 5-10 sophomore, complemented Schaffer's game. He contributed 13 points, three steals and five assists.

"They worked real well together tonight," Brisbin said after the game, referring to the way they ran the fast break.

Brisbin, who used the entire bench, was also pleased with two other players that didn't start, junior Mike Lund and senior Randy Martin.

About Lund, he said, "He did some things that probably weren't noticed by a lot of people. But he got himself in good defensive position. He made some good passes."

The quick passes helped get the offense moving, Brisbin said.

"Randy Martin did a good job when he went in, hustling, and helping us maintain what we'd picked up at that point."

"Some of our starters tonight had a sub-par game, and these kids went in and picked it up and did a good job. And that's real valuable."

The Pioneers were outrebounded 41-38, but had 22 steals, compared to five for Spectrum.

Gordon Klootwyk, a 6-8 senior, grabbed a number of rebounds for Spectrum in the first half.

The next game for Sandy will be Jan. 5. The Pioneers, 1-4, will host David Douglas at 7:45 p.m.

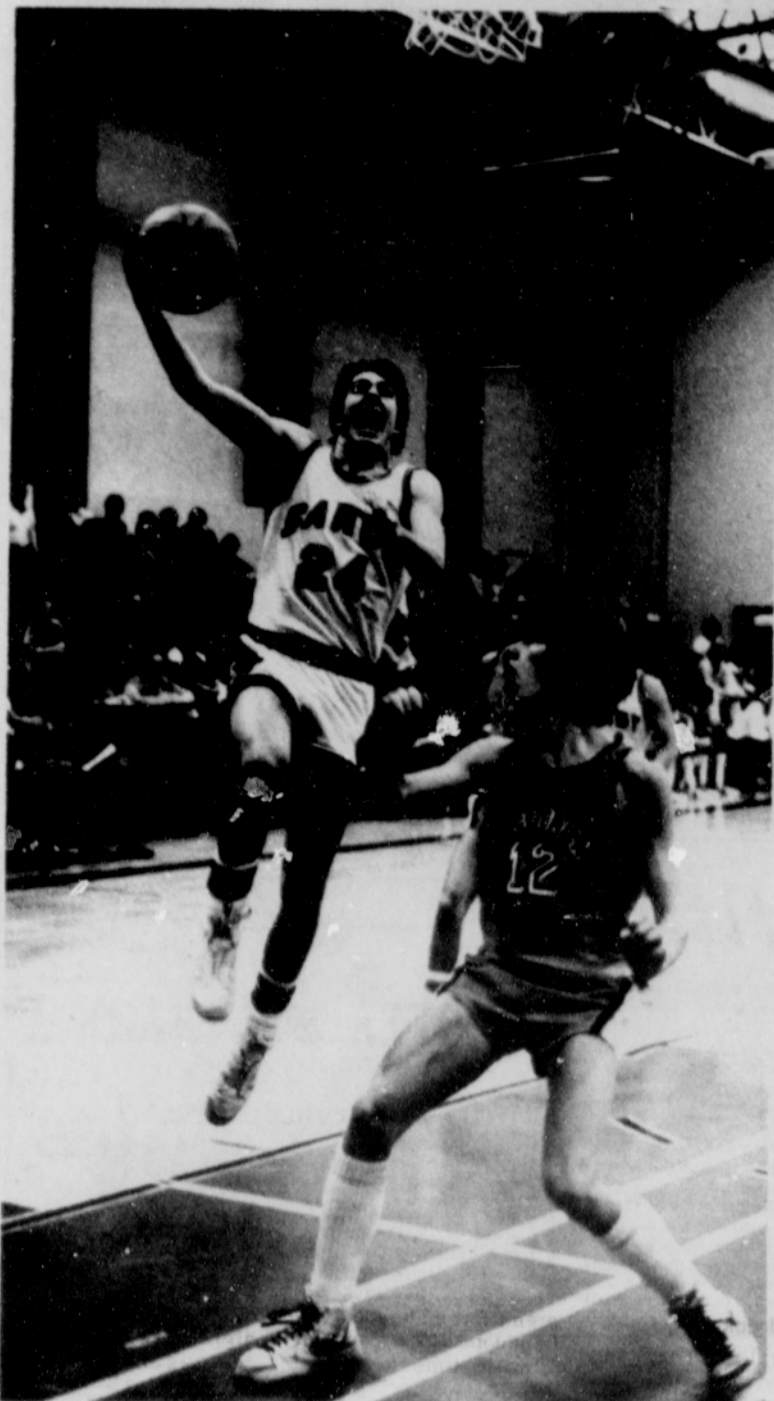
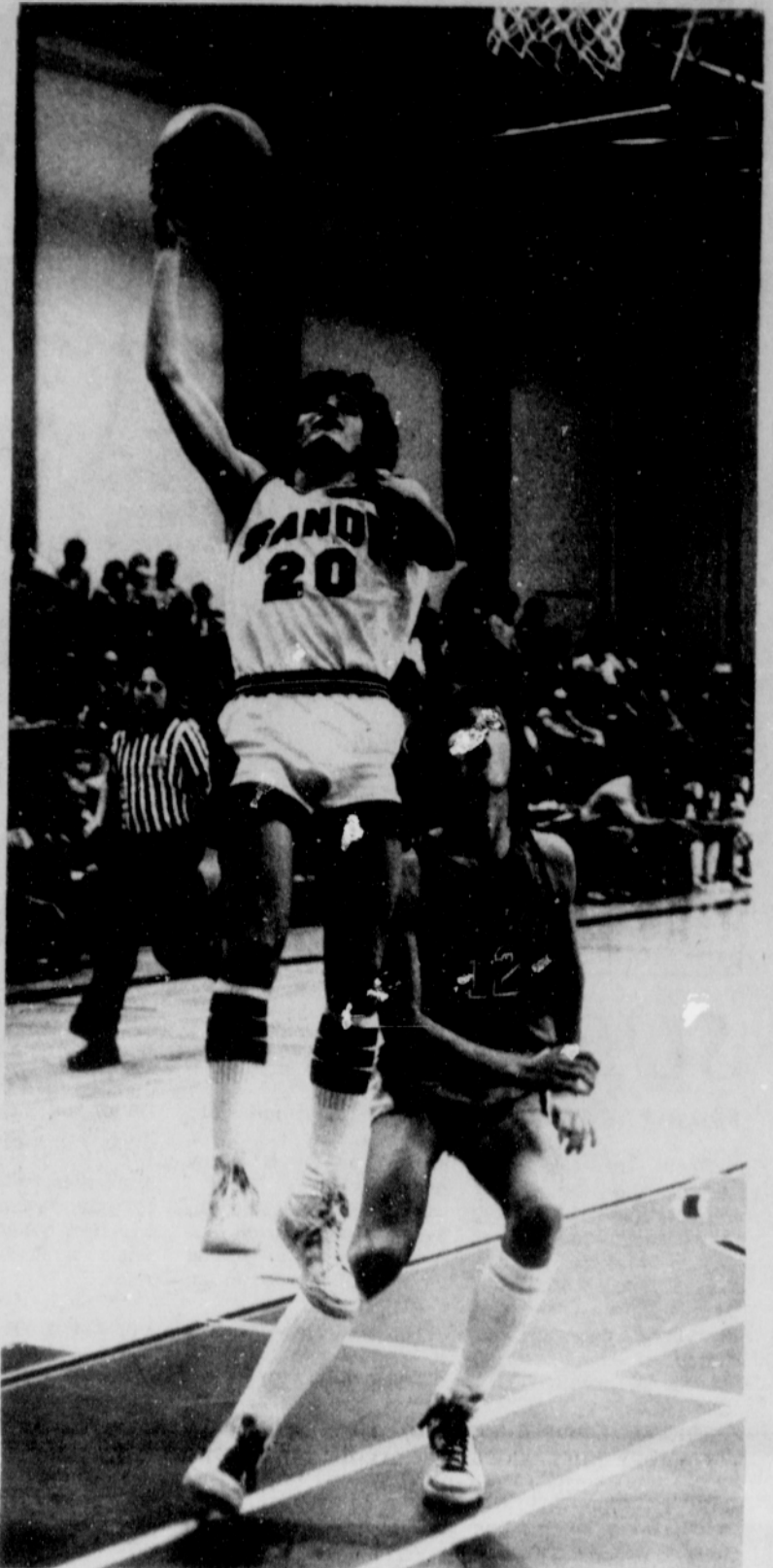

## Boys take first in every event in dual against Oregon City

The boys swim team took first place in every event in a dual with Oregon City last week, winning 98-45.

"They rose to the occasion," said Coach Mark Smith, obviously pleased about the 10 first-place finishes.

Juniors Mark Gunderson, Steve Clark and Darrin Britton, as well as freshman Brian Stamm, have shown considerable improvement, Smith said.

The win gave the Pioneer boys a 2-0

record, and the girls matched it with an 84-71 win of their own.

Smith was especially pleased with Heidi Lamer, who edged Laura Watt in the 100 breast, only to be disqualified for an illegal turn, a judgment call.

"I would give Heidi much credit for the determination she put forth," Smith said.

Had she not been disqualified, Lamer would have turned in personal records in each of the three events in

which she competed.

Smith was also pleased with the Pioneers' sweep in the 100 free. Senior Bonita Connelly took first, junior Donna Nelson second and sophomore Lisa Miller third.

Junior Lisa Izer, sophomore Brenda DuBois and freshman Julie Dasher were also credited with performing well.

DuBois brought down her time in the 100 back from 1:32.8, against Can-

by, to 1:30.5, at Oregon City.

"She was determined to qualify for districts this year and she has done that, early in the season," Smith said. "I'm very pleased with that effort."

He said that sophomore Kelly Russell is also continually improving. Her arm was caught in a berry picker this summer, and swimming fits in well as part of her physical therapy.

"She did very well at this meet. I'm pleased with the way she's coming along," Smith said.

The boys turned in 11 personal records, the girls five.

"This is not unusual," Smith said. "It hasn't been unusual for our teams in the past."

As far as training and times, "we're right where we should be."

The Pioneers' schedule gets tough after Christmas. On Jan. 5 the Pioneers will host McMinnville. The McMinnville boys finished third at state last year, and fell to perennial power David Douglas 89-83 earlier this season.

The McMinnville girls finished 16th in the state tournament last year, and beat David Douglas 84-78.

McMinnville used to be in the Coast Valley League with Sandy, and the Pioneers have only suffered one loss to them. The boys fell 81-75 in 1979, the last time the two teams met.

Some key matchups could include SUHS freshman Jamie Tuttle and Randy Just in the 100 breast, junior Shawn Burns and Just in the 200 free, and SUHS freshman Matt Roth and Gary Squires in the 100 fly.

For the girls, a key matchup may be SUHS senior Gayle Roth and McMinnville's Lianne Henry, both in the 200 IM and the 100 fly.

Both teams' lineups are tentative at this time.

The Pioneers will host Redmond on Jan. 7, and Gresham on Jan. 14.

Smith said that he is pleased to have a number of swimmers already qualified for the district meet.

"We've got a lot of versatility this year," he said. Earlier in the season he pointed out that this could be a key factor in determining the league championship, especially with the girls.

"The team continues to have an outstanding attitude," Smith said.

"I'm very pleased at this time."

## SUHS girls could even record at 3-3 with a win Monday over Centennial

"I think it's real important to have a win under your belt and a solid 500 record going into league, so this is an important game," said Smith, whose girls are 2-3.
