**License renewal easy by mail-in**

If your car license expires this month, you should have your renewal reminder by now and the Oregon Motor Vehicles Division urges you use it to renew by mail rather than in a DMV office.

DMV field offices are generally more crowded during even-numbered years, such as 1982. Under the two-year registration system, those years have the highest number of vehicle expirations—in some months 40,000 or more higher than the comparable month in an odd-number year.

January car licenses due to expire at the end of the month total more than 103,000. If half the owners choose to renew in person, that will bring 50,000 customers to the field offices in January who could renew by mail and save the time and cost of a trip to the DMV office.

**Liquor sales boost local coffers**

Liquor sales in Oregon hit an all-time high last year and, as a result, local governments received more money than ever from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

1980-81 fiscal year—an increase of 3.17 percent over the previous year.

The city of Sandy received \$25,494.59, and Clackamas County received \$594,066.68 for the fiscal year. This doesn't include funds received from city revenue sharing or Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account.

Liquor sales for the fiscal year exceeded all previous years, amounting to \$154,780,477. This was an increase of more than 5.5 percent over the 1979-80 fiscal year.

State law provides that 36 percent of the net revenue from liquor sales and license fees, and 50 percent of all privilege tax collections on beer and wine goes to the state General Fund (\$36,323,755 in fiscal year 1980-81); 20 percent to the cities (\$12,972,769); 10 percent to counties (\$6,486,384), and 14 percent to the city revenue sharing account (\$9,080,938) which is allocated by the Executive Department on a quarterly basis.

The remaining 50 percent of the privilege taxes collected on beer and wine is earmarked for the Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account.

**Line offers insurance tips**

Sandy residents now have a fast way to find out the answer to insurance questions without charge.

A toll-free telephone line to give consumers information on auto, homeowners and other lines of insurance was established Monday by the Insurance Information Institute in cooperation with Oregon's insurance industry.

The Insurance Information Line of Oregon can be reached by dialing 1-800-426-1027 anywhere in the state.

"The new service is an extension of the Institute's existing consumer information efforts," said Scott Carpenter, regional manager.

"While we will continue to supply information to the news media and to organized consumer groups, the Insurance Information Line of Oregon will allow us to deal directly with individual customers who have concerns or problems."

Because of budgetary cutbacks, the Oregon Insurance Division has been forced to reduce the size of its consumer affairs staff, so the change was welcomed by state officials.

"The new consumer information line," said Oregon Insurance Commissioner Josephine Driscoll, "will allow our consumer affairs staff to operate more efficiently, handling the consumer complaints that we are charged by law with handling an referring the consumer information calls that the Institute can handle."
