PBS begins productions

John Cheever play will kick it all off

What may well be public television's most ambitious effort at broadcasting a continuing series of high-quality dramatic productions gets under way Tuesday, Jan. 12, when the curtain goes up on John Cheever's teleplay "The Shady Hill Kidnapping."

For 25 consecutive Tuesday evenings, "Playhouse" is to offer dramas, comedies and musicals — some of the programs will be an hour long; others will be two hours in length and several are to air in multiple segments. The programs will be drawn from the best material available, both here and abroad.

David M. Davis is the director of the new drama series, which represents the combined efforts of four public television stations: KCET, Los Angeles; WGBH, Boston, South Carolina, ETV and WNET, New York.

"Art for art's sake" is a pleasant ideal to contemplate, but someone must pay the piper, as well as the stage hands, casts, producers, PBS personnel and heaven only knows who else if the programs are to be aired.

The "American Playhouse" series is made possible by the public television stations, The Program Fund of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the National Endowment for the Arts and Atlantic Richfield Company. The initial budget: A tidy \$13.6 million.

Cheever's scalpel-sharp dissection of character has never been better than in "The Shady Hill Kidnappers," the contemporary comedy of errors about a suburban

family. Videotaped on location in Connecticut under the direction of Paul Bogart, the play stars George Grizzard, Polly Holliday, Paul Dooley and Celeste Holm, with a strong supporting cast.

Second program, Jan. 19, is "King of America," an original, 90-minute film tracing the experiences of a young, strong-willed Greek sailor who jumps ship in New York Harbor in 1915 with hopes of making a new life for himself in America. Larry Atlas, Andreas Katsulas, Barry Miller and Michael Walden are the principals.

The third program "Seguin," is another 90-minuter, based on the life and memoirs of one of early Texas's unsung heroes, Juan Neomuceno Sequin. A Martinez is starred in the title role. Edward James Olmos is seen as Gen. Santa Ana.

Executive director Davis has this to say of the first three plays:

"(They) represent a composite picture of America. For the first time, television is dealing with the American experience in all its variety and depth. Public television is holding up a mirror to the country, its foibles and its strengths as we find entertainment, drama and humor in every corner of American life and history."

It is impossible to list here all the casts and credits for the 19 productions for the 25-week run of "American Playhouse" in its first season. Nor can the authors, playwrights, writers and composers be catalogued.

The word "notable" might well cover the situation as the house lights dim, the audience settles into its seats and the curtain goes up Jan. 12 on "American Playhouse." No standing in line for tickets, no need to don your best bib and tucker. Just flick the channel selector to PBS, and you'll be right there, front row, center, as the play transports you to "Shady Hill."
