Costa Rican missionary schedules Sandy ministry

"The people of Latin America are hungry for the word of God," according to the Rev. Gerald B. Robeson, Assemblies of God missionary to Latin America. "We are making ambitious plans for a nationwide spiritual revival."

Robeson will be the guest speaker Sunday, Jan. 17, at 9:45 a.m. and 11 a.m. and will be ministering in music at the 6 p.m. service at Sandy Assembly of God, Pastor Dale Edwards announced.

Robeson, and his wife, Carol, and their two daughters have been

ministering in Costa Rica since 1973.

They specialize in open-air crusades during which services are held every night and new congregations are formed from crusade converts. Permanent meeting places are built and the new churches continue. Some of these crusade churches have nearly 2,000 members now.

The Robesons also maintain an active television and radio ministry. They have produced more than 485 Christian television and radio programs and have

been responsible for three radio programs a day.

Robeson is also the author of a book, "Faith in Eruption," and a solo trumpeter on numerous long-playing trumpet recordings.

When they return to the mission field, they will be taking their ministry to the people of Paraguay. They plan to be involved in church building and establishing new congregations through open-air crusades, as well as beginning a television and radio ministry there.

Baha'is schedule speaker

A former member of the National Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is will be the speaker this Saturday as members of the Sandy Baha'i community invite residents interested in learning more about the faith to a public meeting.

Paul R. Pettit will give an informal presentation of the fundamentals of the Baha'i Faith and answer questions from the audience at the 7 p.m. meeting in the Sandy Community Center Jan. 16.

Pettit served in the National Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of the United States, one of more than 120 such bodies worldwide.

He was a delegate to the International Baha'i Convention in 1968. That convention elected the supreme governing body of the Baha'is, the Universal

House of Justice, located in Haifa, Israel on the side of Mt. Carmel.

Pettit served on the National Teaching Committee and is currently a member of the Auxiliary Board.

The Baha'i Faith began in 1844 in Iran. It has adherents in more than 100,000 locations worldwide, including more than 200 locations in Oregon.

The Baha'i Faith is based on the teachings of Baha'u'llah, its founder. Some of the Baha'is' beliefs include racial unity, world peace, equality of men and women, and the essential unity of all the world's religions.

These beliefs have made the Baha'is targets for oppression by the current Iranian government. Many members have lost their homes and lives in the past

year.

Bill Knight-Weiler, chairman of the Sandy spiritual assembly of the Baha'i Faith, invited anyone to attend the meeting, for which there will be no charge or collection.

Former prison inmate tells story Friday

A former Folsom Prison inmate will share his story with the Hoodland chapter of the Full Gospel Businessmen's Fellowship International next Friday, Jan. 22, at 7 p.m. at T.J.'s Fireside Dining in Sandy.

Santiago D. Saldade spent 20 years in and out of prisons. In 1970 he was released from La Tuna Texas Federal Prison, after serving five years of a seven-year sentence for smuggling heroin.

Nine months after his release, he was sent to Folsom Prison for two years to life for shooting a man. After two and a half years in Folsom, Saldade was sent to a work camp

where he and a partner escaped.

He was on the lam for three years and 10 months. While he was running he accepted Christianity.

He was picked up in The Dalles in 1977 and returned to Folsom where he was sentenced to 46 months to serve on the escape and two years on each of his three prior sentences.

However, he says, through the power of prayers, both his and friends, he was released in less than one year.

C. Augustine

Funeral services for Charles Augustine, former owner of the Hoodland Telephone Company, were held Wednesday in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Interment was at Gethsemani Cemetery in Portland.

Mr. Augustine died Jan. 10 in Gresham. He was 74.

Born July 16, 1907 in New Haven, Conn., he graduated with honors in electrical engineering from Yale in 1928.

He entered the communications field and was employed by the South New England Telephone Company for 20 years in Connecticut. In the late 1940s he served as president of a Virginia telephone company.

He moved to Oregon in 1958 and purchased the Hoodland Telephone Company. After selling the business, he remained an active part of the company until his retirement at age 65.

He was an active part of the Hoodland community as a member of the Mt. Hood Lions Club and Mountain Players Association. He served on the Welches School Board and on water

and planning boards for the area.

Previously he had been honored in the Governor's Foot Guard in Connecticut and was a member of the Connecticut Society of Civil Engineers.

He is survived by four sisters, Elsie Augustine of Brightwood, Lucille Brooks in Connecticut, Ann Osborne in Florida and Elizabeth Turpin in Arkansas.

The family suggests memorials be made to the Mt. Hood Lions Club or the Mountain Players Association.

Funeral services for former Sandy resident Albert Concannon were held Monday at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Portland. He was 59.

Mr. Concannon was born Jan. 22, 1922 and attended Sandy Union High School from 1940-42. He served as a merchant marine during World War II. He had been ill since the war.

Now you can deposit up to \$2000 per year, or 100% of your taxable income, whichever is less. If you have a non-working spouse, you may contribute up to \$2250 between you. And if both you and your spouse work, you can each have an IRA and deduct a total of \$4000 from your 1982 joint taxable income.*
