"They're gonna work every way they can to help see this through. I think it also helps to educate the parents as to how that service is to be used."

"It has to be a choice. It has to be 'yes, they get it' or 'no, the whole district goes without.' And I wouldn't want to make it 'no' because I know the whole district couldn't go without. It is a great ser-

vice."

Dick Hoffman, board member, said that a decision should be made and that he was in favor of eliminating this restriction because the Government Camp parents had agreed to police themselves to keep the bus from being used for skiing.

"I think there are going to be exceptions to the 48-hour rule," said Hoff-

man.

"There are going to be problems that will come up, perhaps even making it one day in advance. And I think it should be held absolutely, even down here (in other parts of the district), to notes from their folks."
