

Pioneers to host Canby for key TVL battle

The Pioneer boys won a close one Tuesday night, nipping Silverton 53-51 in Timber Valley League play.

Senior Bob Nippert contributed 25 points to the effort.

Sandy is tied for second in the TVL with Sweet Home. Both have 4-2 records.

Oregon City, a 61-52 winner over Sandy Friday

night, sits atop of the standings along with Canby. Both teams are 5-1.

West Linn is 3-3, Molalla is 2-1, Estacada 1-5 and Silverton 0-6.

Coach Dan Brisbin said, however, that Silverton's record is deceiving. They've played most of their games on the road, and now that they'll be playing at home, they're going to cause some people

some problems, he said.

Silverton has decent size, Brisbin said, and at one time it was thought they'd be a factor in the league race.

Brisbin said that they did a good job of getting the ball inside to Nippert Tuesday night, which is something they need to be doing.

He added that they also got the ball in to him for

three quarters against Oregon City. Nippert scored 20 points Friday night.

In the first half against Silverton the Pioneers found themselves down 19-12. Brisbin put in Randy Martin, Mike Lund and Marvin Schaffer.

"That crew went in with some aggressiveness and we outscored them 9-0 through the rest of the

half," Brisbin said.

Schaffer, who scored eight points, did a good job of getting us going offensively, Brisbin said.

He got the ball up court and took control of the offensive set, he said.

Brisbin said that Martin did a good job of going to the boards.

He added that rebounding is an area they need to work on, and do almost dai-

ly.

Nippert, Sandy's 6-5 center, pulled down 11 Tuesday night. He grabbed seven against Oregon City.

Sandy was outrebounded 32-19 Friday night against Oregon City.

The Pioneers at one time had things going their way in the Oregon City game.

Steve Pettingill, 6-2 sophomore who injured his ankle Monday in practice (and will be out for about a week), scored on a short

jumper in the third quarter to give Sandy a 42-33 lead.

Oregon City's Rich Gaiser and Jake Thompson, two key players, were in foul trouble.

Sandy cooled off in the fourth quarter, however, and Oregon City clinched the game with an effective delay game and good free throw shooting.

About the Canby game, which will be played in Sandy, Brisbin said, "We will need to be aggressive and

jumping well Friday night because Canby is the kind of a team that will pick you apart with their passing."

The Sandy girls got back on the winning track Monday night, defeating Canby 51-45.

The Pioneers are 3-4 and midway through the league schedule.

"We have an opportunity to be in one of those first four positions," Coach John Smith said. "It'll take somewhere between a 6-1, or maybe a 4-3, second half."

Oregon City is 7-0 in

league play. West Linn and Silverton (a 50-33 loss for Sandy Friday) are 5-2. Molalla is 4-3, Sweet Home 3-4, Estacada 1-6 and Canby 0-7.

The top team in the league is assured a berth to the state tournament. The third- and fourth-place teams play, with the winner playing the second-place team for the second berth.

Smith said that there

were some bright spots Monday night against Canby. "We moved the ball well," he said.

Smith said that although Canby does not have a lot of talent, that they are a scrappy bunch, and he felt the Pioneer girls matched their aggressiveness.
