Scholarships available for winter, spring

Several scholarships are now available for the winter and spring terms at Mt. Hood Community College, according to Carl Rawe, director of financial aid.

The King Lauderback Memorial Scholarship for \$375 will be awarded winter quarter to a first-year food science technology major enrolled full-time (12 credit hours minimum).

The student must have completed at least 12 credit hours fall quarter with a minimum 2.0 GPA, and must be financially needy. One-half of the scholarship is available for winter term use and the other half will

be available for spring term.

Three \$165 in-district tuition scholarships will be awarded for spring quarter use by the General Telephone Company of the Northwest.

The applicant must be enrolled in journalism arts technology, radio production technology, television production technology or graphics technology, and must be a returning MHCC student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and a minimum of 24 credit hours completed.

Two \$165 auto parts technology scholarships, sponsored by Performance

Warehouse, will be awarded winter quarter. Applicants must be enrolled full-time in the auto parts technology program with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better.

Three letters of recommendation must be submitted, from a current or prior employer, an auto parts instructor and a character reference from a friend or relative.

Job and academic performance and occupational promise will be important factors in the selection process, and financial need will be taken into consideration but will not be a determining factor.

The National Blank Book Co. and the MHCC Bookstore will award \$107.65 winter term to be used for books and merchandise at the college bookstore.

Applicants must be

enrolled full-time in the two-year business management program, and have completed at least one quarter in the program. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 and be ineligible for other types of financial aid.

Applications for all of the mentioned scholarships are available in the financial aid office (Room 1152) at Mt. Hood Community College. Completed forms must be returned to the financial aid office no later than Feb. 17.

'Old Fashioned Love-A-Fair' Clackamas County theme

This year's Clackamas County Fair, instead of ending on Saturday as in the past, will run through Sunday, it was announced recently by Jerry Mickelsen, fair manager.

The 1982 fair, which has taken for its theme "An Old Fashioned Love-A-Fair," will open Aug. 17 and continue through Aug. 22.

Rodeo performances will start at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday and at 2 p.m. on Sunday. Ken Marts of Canby will again officiate as manager of the annual rodeo.

As in the past, general admission to the grounds will entitle fairgoers to free attendance at rodeo performances, outdoor stage

shows, and other fair attractions.

The search is now on for a "Miss Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo" to act as hostess for the annual event and to represent Clackamas County later at Tula, Okla. in the Interna-

tional Rodeo Association contest for a national Miss Rodeo USA.

The Clackamas County Fair Board voted recently to restrict eligibility for the local contest to residents of Clackamas County.

Snow costs county

This winter's snow and ice has put a chill on Clackamas County's road funds.

More than \$100,000 slid out of the budget to pay for snow plowing and sanding county roads between Dec. 28 and Jan. 15.

The exact cost, including salaries, overtime pay, materials and equipment was \$105,710, according to County Road Superintendent Hugh Kalani. For the milder 1980-81 winter, total snow removal cost was \$2,000.

"Winter weather is so unpredictable that we can't budget for plowing and sanding. When the snow and ice hit, we just get out there and do the

best we can to keep our

roads open," Kalani said. County road workers were on duty around the clock. Some worked 12-hour shifts and there was "double coverage" (overlapping shifts) for the morning and evening rush hours, according to the road superintendent.

During the 18-day period, 54 road workers plowed and sanded 2,700 miles of road. "The county roads total only 1,600 miles, but we worked the main roads over and over," he said.

To balance the \$100,000-plus expense, Kalani said some road overlay (paving) projects may have to be postponed or cut.
