

Police report:

Test driver fails to return

Sandy police are looking for a man who took a 1982 Chevrolet Blazer for a test drive Sunday and hasn't been seen since.

According to personnel at Carlson Chevrolet in Sandy, a man approached a salesman between 4 and 4:30 p.m. Sunday and asked to test drive an \$18,000 Blazer.

Salespeople at the local dealership discovered the vehicle had not been returned when they inventoried as they were closing at approximately 9 p.m.

The man stopped with the Blazer at Shorty's Corner and purchased \$20 in fuel. The vehicle was last seen heading west on Highway 26.

The driver was described as a white male, between 30 and 35 years of age, about six feet tall and weighing 160 pounds. He has dark hair and a thin mustache. Sunday he was wearing a blue-and-white checkered shirt and blue jeans.

The Blazer is described as black

with a silver stripe across the bottom, with aluminum mag wheels and four-speed transmission. It is diesel-powered.

Sandy police are investigating a rash of criminal mischief reports from Saturday evening when the windows of eight vehicles were reported smashed by a large rock.

According to police reports, sometime between 10 p.m. and midnight windows in vehicles parked on Gary Street, Scenic Street, Barker Court, Pleasant Street (twice), Wolf Drive, Scales Avenue and at Paul Koch Ford were damaged.

Police estimate that the damage to each car was between \$200 and \$300. There are no suspects.

In what police believe was a related incident, Paul Koch Ford personnel reported that two spare tires were taken Tuesday from two pickup trucks that were parked in the company lot.

A Sandy man told police Saturday that someone took his tool box

and tools from the back of his pickup truck while it was parked in the lot outside Toni's Restaurant and Lounge between 1 and 1:20 a.m.

Police said the tools and tool box were valued at \$2,000.

According to Sandy police, a local patrolman was assisting an Oregon State Police trooper last Tuesday evening, Feb. 16, on a traffic stop when a passing vehicle swerved close to the two officers. The vehicle was later discovered in the ditch just east of Sandy.

Larry Ervin Vance of Sandy was arrested and lodged in Clackamas County Jail on charges of driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

Sandy Sentry personnel reported two shoplift attempts during the week.

Last Wednesday, an 11-year-old was cited after reportedly taking three candy bars. Monday, a 13-year-old was cited into Clackamas County Juvenile Court.

Fitness advocate kicks off drive

The Sandy Optimist Club launches its membership drive this evening with a dinner at the Sandy Community Center.

Ogie Shaw of Fitness Factors, a Hillsboro-based firm specializing in fitness motivation, will be guest speaker.

Anyone who is interested in working in a youth service organization is invited to attend the dinner with club members at 7 p.m. at the Community Center, 38348 Pioneer Blvd.

There will be a small fee

Shaw will focus his talk on how to keep yourself motivated to stay with a fitness program. He will also demonstrate a concept of exercise used by the Apollo astronauts.

The educational segment of Shaw's presentation will attempt to clear the air concerning myths and misconceptions surrounding fitness in America.

He will demonstrate and explain the importance of measuring fat percentage and show the easiest

method for measuring blood pressure known today. Motivational keys for staying with a fitness program will also be explained.

A strong advocate of the Apollo Aerokinetic System, a little publicized exercise program used by American astronauts, Shaw will demonstrate this quick and efficient breakthrough in daily fitness with audience participation.

Shaw, a graduate of the University of North

Carolina, has served as conditioning consultant to the Seattle Seahawks and other professional teams, as well as dozens of industrial organizations.

He was presented a commendation by Chief Bruce Baker after two months as a Portland police officer and was named Outstanding Rookie as district director for Fitness Motivation Institute of America. He is currently executive director of Ogie Shaw's Fitness Factors.

Readathon battles Multiple Sclerosis

Students at Kelso School and in the Boring and Cottrell school districts will have their noses buried in books until the first part of April to raise funds for the Multiple Sclerosis Society.

The society's Oregon chapter readathon involves first- through eighth-graders who find sponsors to pledge money for each

book they read. Beverly Bowman, Oregon Society's readathon coordinator, said she expects about 200 schools to participate in this spring's readathon.

Last year, more than \$140,000 was raised by Oregon and Clark County, Wash., students.

"Evidence continues to

mount," Bowman said, "that the incentive to read for the need of others and the chance to win awards are strong stimulants to acquiring the reading habit."

Students who complete the readathon will earn coupons for free McDonald's hamburgers and the chance to win one of 50 bicycles that will be given away in a grand prize drawing.

Funds raised are returned to MS patients in local communities in the form of counseling, treatment clinics, special equipment and research. MS afflicts the neurological center with crippling effects, producing disturbances of the body's sensory and motor systems.

The non-contagious affliction hits persons from 15 to 55 years old.

Due to political uncertainty, Uganda's government granted them only a three-month visitor visa. Finally, they began evangelistic work among the large Asian population of Mombasa, Kenya.

Along with open air meetings and Bible clubs, the Dobras make contacts as they visit shops in the area and direct five-day camps for high school boys and girls.

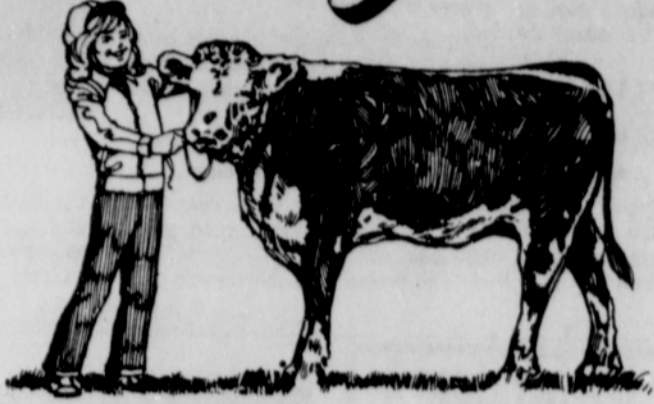

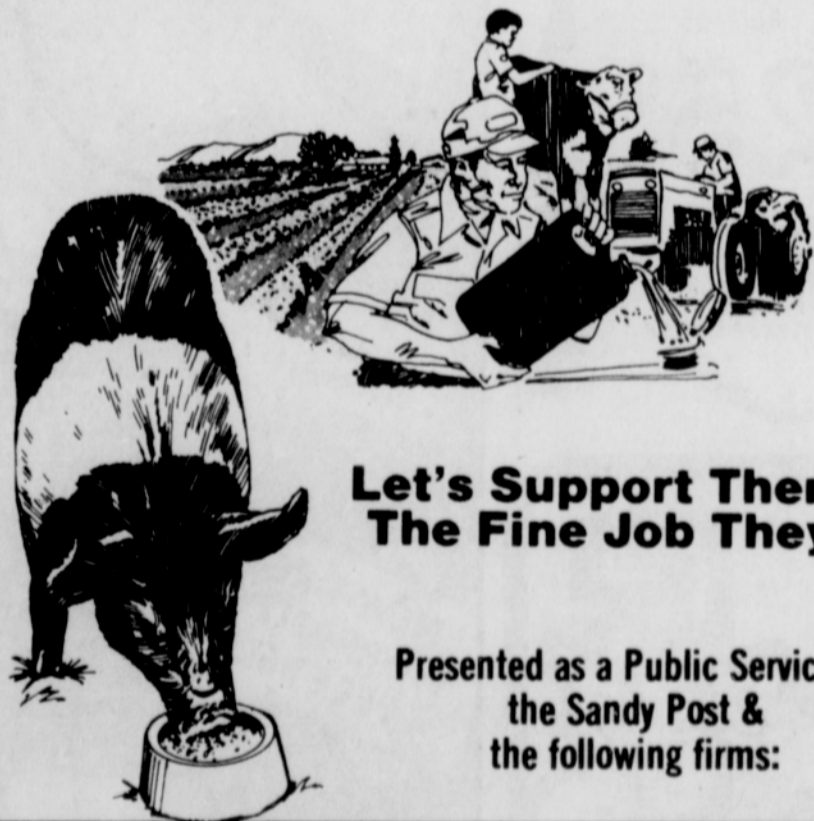
