# Girls get two key victories

The Sandy girls got two important wins last week. They beat Canby, 50-43, to clinch a fourth-place TVL finish in the final league game. Then, to begin the TVL playoffs for a state berth, the girls beat third-place finisher Silverton, 54-50.

Dawn New contributed 19 points, and Linda Mosbrucker 18, against Canby.

New, a senior, and Mosbrucker, a junior, teamed up again against Silverton, with New contributing 23 and Mosbrucker 15.

Coach John Smith was pleased with the wins. "We could have checked in our gear a week ago," he pointed out.

He felt that the two wins helped them "finish the season in style."

The girls led from three to seven points throughout the Canby game.

New contributed nine rebounds and nine blocked shots during the Canby game. Ami Aschoff contributed seven rebounds, two assists and two steals.

Sharon Jensen turned in a balanced performance against Canby, scoring nine points, grabbing six rebounds, making seven steals and contributing four assists.

Cindy McCoy was the leading rebounder with 10.

The Silverton win was also a key one for the girls as they lost twice to them in league play.

Sandy led by 10 points, with 1:20 left to play. The Pioneers missed a few shots at the free throw line and Silverton connected on a shot at the buzzer to get it within four.

Silverton's Scott Long was fouled, and connected on both ends of a one-and-one, but it was academic. One second remained on the clock after his free throws.

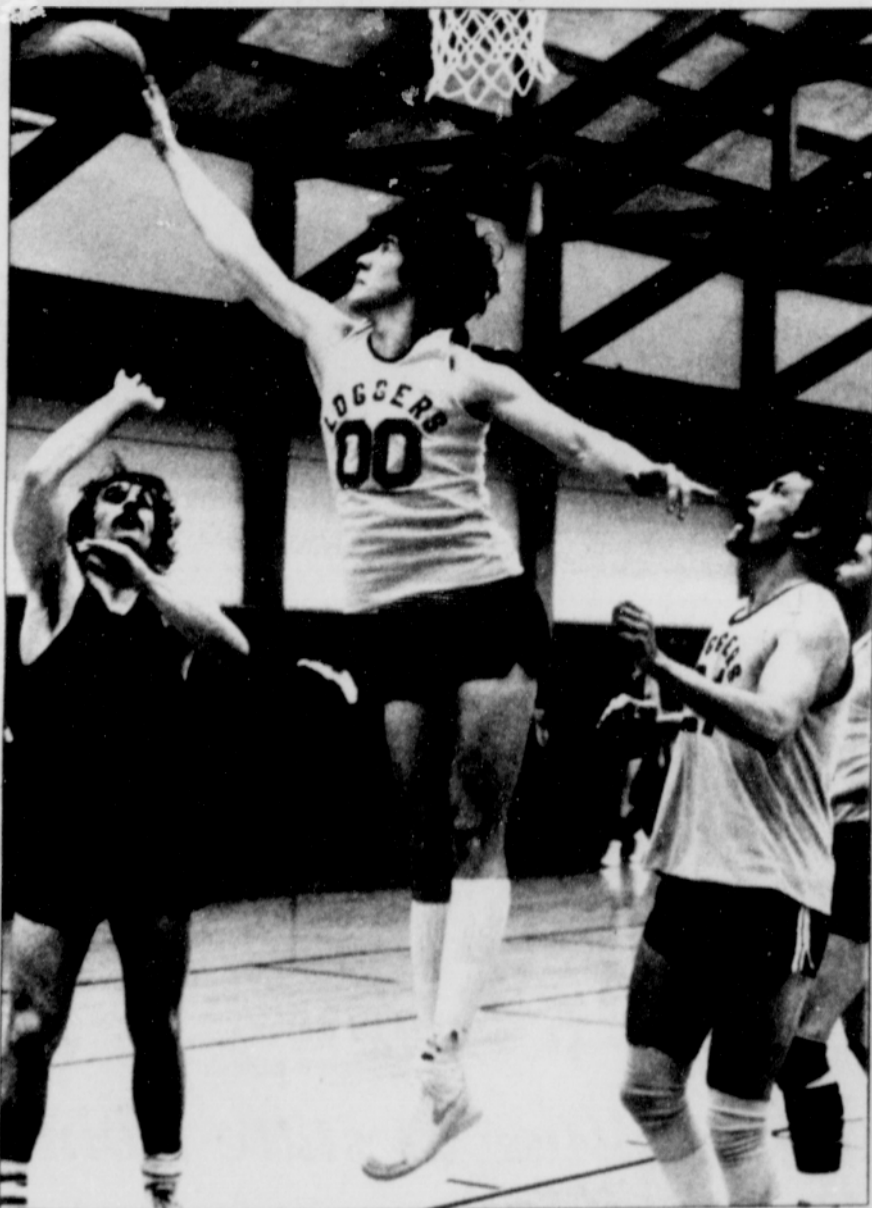
Nippert tied the game up again at 49-49 a little over a minute later with another inside shot.
