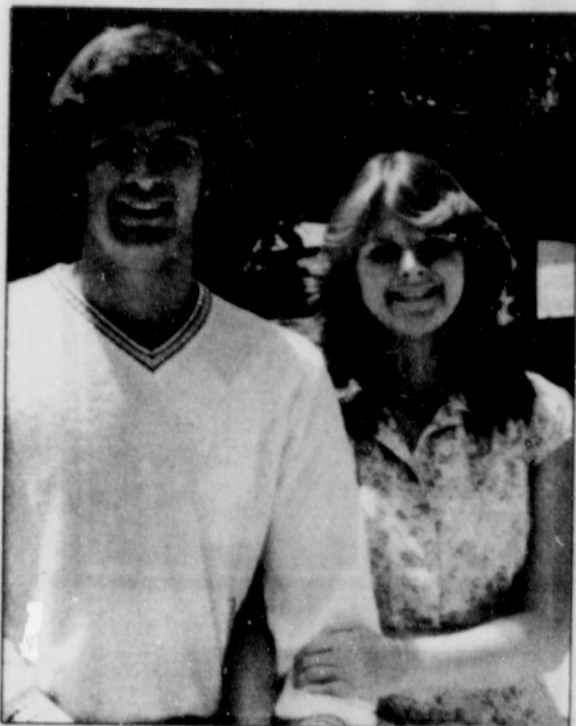

QUESTION: Shall Mt. Hood Community College District be authorized a \$1,640,598 operating levy for 1982-83 outside constitutional limits?

PURPOSE: Mt. Hood Community College offers vocational, lower division transfer and adult education courses to more than 20,000 individual students at a cost per student less than the state average for community colleges and public schools. These programs are financed by state aid, student tuition and fees, local property taxes and other sources. The college's current property tax authority is not sufficient to meet current program needs primarily because of reduced aid and despite significant increases in tuition and fees.

With this operating levy, local support for operations of the college in 1982-83 will be \$8,372,305. The college's current tax base will authorize \$6,731,707, all of which is eligible for partial state funding. The remaining need of \$1,640,598 will be authorized by this operating levy.

If the measure is approved, \$509,612 of the operating levy in the 1982-83 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$1,049,986 of the taxes will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION City of Sandy Oregon

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, March 30, 1982, there will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Sandy in a special election within the corporate boundaries of the City of Sandy, Oregon, for their approval or rejection a certain question, the ballot title of which is designated as follows:

Ballot A. Special Levy Partially State Financed For City Budget

QUESTION: Shall the City of Sandy be authorized a \$404,076.44 special property tax levy for 1982-83 outside the constitutional limits?

EXPLANATION: This measure, which would be partially State financed, if approved, will authorize the City of Sandy to levy property taxes of \$404,076.44 in excess of the six (6%) percent limitation set forth in Article XI, section II of the Oregon State Constitution.

The proposed total tax levy to support the operations of the city for fiscal year 1982-83 is \$418,219.00, which exceeds the City authorized tax base for that period by \$404,076.44. The proposed total tax levy is entirely within State Ballot A limitations. The authorized tax base of \$14,142.56 may be levied with no further approval by the voters.

If this measure is approved, \$418,219.00 of the taxes levied in the 1982-83 fiscal year will be financed partially by the State of Oregon. This will result in an estimated rate of \$4.86 per \$1,000 of assessed value exclusive of levies for bond principal and interest.

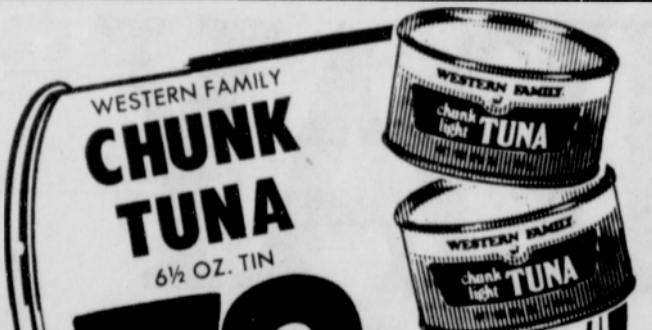

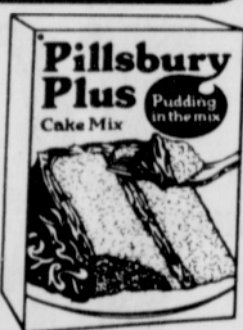
