Merchants move to attract shoppers

New machine shop opens

The new shop will specialize in engine tune-ups and brake jobs, but also will handle complete

cylinder head rebuilding, head and block servicing, glass beading and hot tanking.

State fines Sandy roofer

A Sandy man has been fined by the Builders Board for roofing a house while not registered with the board.

The board, a division of the state Department of Commerce, assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty against

W.E. Woods of Sandy for the infraction.

The Builders Board was established in 1972 to register all persons who perform work on residences. As of March 1, 14,456 builders were active-

ly registered in the state. Non-registered builders are subject to civil penalties of up to \$1,000 for each offense. Since its establishment, the board has assessed approximately \$400,000 in civil penalties.

Emergency training due

The American Red Cross will offer a series of classes designed to train volunteers interested in becoming involved in disaster relief assistance.

The classes are co-sponsored by the city of Sandy and the Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Church as part of a cooperative effort to establish an emergency relief program for the Sandy area.

The idea for the relief plan was planted two years ago by a major snowstorm that highlighted the lack of coordination between responsible agencies, according to Community Services Director Sandra Potter Marquardt.

For the past year she has worked with Sandy Police Chief Fred Punzel, the

American Red Cross and Clackamas County Emergency Services fine-tuning the program.

Participants in the classes will gain necessary skills that will enable them to lend assistance in a variety of areas, ranging from helping families who are fire victims to canvassing a neighborhood devastated by an ice storm.

Volunteers will also be needed to manage a shelter for victims driven from their homes and in need of food, clothing and temporary sleeping quarters.

There will be three classes. The first will deal with emergency assistance for families. It will be held next Saturday and Sunday, March 20 and 21, from 1 to 8 p.m.

The second class will cover surveying and assessing damage. It will be held Thursday, March 25, from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m.

The final installment will deal with shelter management and mass feeding. It will be held Saturday, March 27, from 1:30 to 8:30 p.m.

All classes will be held at the Sandy Community Center, 38348 Pioneer Blvd. For registration for the sessions or for more information about how you can help, call the Community Center at 668-5569.

Youngbar said selection of merchandise actually available in Sandy presents a problem in shopper

misconception SAM store members must combat.

Other image problems SAM stores hope to correct include shopper belief that goods cost more in Sandy and that service in Sandy stores is anything less than top rate.

Sheriff SAM says, "We're taking aim on high prices."

He also says, "No need to ride west, pardner!" and "We're ridin' 'gainst that out-a-town bunch of storekeep' cutthroats."

Sandy Area Merchants also will give lucky St. Patrick's Daze shoppers gift certificates worth up to \$100 in participating stores.

Unified strength of Sandy stores who promote together with a common theme can revitalize business in Sandy and pump new life in the city's economy, Youngbar feels.

A theme approach also could draw shoppers from outside town.

"It's such an easy thing to pick up on here," he said of the western approach with Sheriff SAM.

Now SAM's chairman would like to remodel Sandy storefronts with a common western look.

Unified Sandy stores could rival outside shopping centers for attention, he said.

"Now is the time," he said. "Nothing could be more appropriate than building business. So many average citizens think something constructive should be done, and that's what we're going to be

about," he said of SAM's aggressive new look.

"I can't think of a genuine benefit from a stagnant, repressive economy," Youngbar said. "What we do see are people who are stragglers of no growth. And there is no such thing. If you have a no-growth philosophy, you're going backward."

"The object (of SAM) is to get unity and strength from numbers in these promotions. We want to show Sandy area residents the variety of goods and service right here."
