Layng serving in Japan

Airman Kevin D. Layng, son of Mr. and Mrs. George M. Layng of 14350 SE Frank Ave., Boring, has arrived for duty at Yokota Air Base, Japan.

Layng, a law enforcement specialist with the 475th Security Policy Squadron, was previously assigned at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.

A little over 63 years ago Agnus Hefley Rowe, wife of Henry S. Rowe, the founder of the town of Rowe (which is now known as Rhododendron), died at the age of 57.

Rowe, whose husband platted the area east of Zigzag Creek (as the river was called back then), had been a widow for a little less than five years.

During that time she took over her husband's real estate interests, and sold off large tracts of land, which helped encourage the settlement to grow into a popular colony of summer homes.

Rowe, who resided in Portland, recorded her last will and testament on March 12, 1917, in Portland, when she "was upwards of 55 years of age."

HUSBAND WAS MAYOR

It was witnessed by G.M. Worrell and George W. Stapleton, two prominent members of the Oregon Bar Association and close friends of her late husband who, at one time, served as mayor of Portland.

"Being of sound and disposing mind and memory and not acting under the undue influence or coercion of any person whomsoever," Rowe requested that her 28-year-old son, Donald Hefley Rowe of Portland, be administrator of her estate. "I direct that my body be decently buried," wrote Rowe, "without undue ceremony but with proper regard to my station in life and the condition of my estate at the time of my death."

She also instructed her

estate's executor, when there are "funds in his hands belonging to my estate sufficient for the purpose, he pay all indebtedness and the costs and expenses of my last sickness and burial."

After payment of all indebtedness, Rowe requested that the remaining real and personal property of her estate be divided equally among her two sons, Donald of Portland, and 35-year-old Harry Ocur of Seattle.

\$40,000 ESTATE
Rowe died on April 16, 1919, in Seattle, leaving behind an estate of \$30,000 worth of real property, and personal property of \$10,000, consisting of mortgages and cash.
