"I feel the Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo would be a great one to promote," she said. "Living in the Gresham-Sandy area, I would have a great opportunity to help promote it more."

The winner will be selected at a coronation

ball this Saturday evening, March 27, at 8 p.m. in the main pavilion at the Clackamas County fairgrounds in Canby. Master of ceremonies will be Richard Ross, KATU-TV news anchor man. The new first lady will be crowned by Joni Harms, 1981 Miss Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo.

Warren has been riding ever since she got her first horse when she was 6 years old. With a new horse, Miss Mirlee, she feels her chances are greatly enhanced in the horsemanship portion of the competi-

tion. Contestants will include Rosemary Anderson, 21, Estacada; Brenda Lee Bennett, 18, Colton; Bonnie Block, 20, Colton; Diana Brown, 21, Canby; Kimberly Buchanan, 18, Canby, and Karen Shirley, 18, Mulino.

Miss Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo will receive a complete western outfit, a \$500 cash award to be used either as a scholarship or as expense money toward participation in the Miss Rodeo USA contest, and a three-month modeling course at the Edeline Training Center, valued at \$1,200.

She has taken her horse to competitions at the county and state fairs and has been a 4-H member for the eight years she has lived in Boring.

The 1981 SUHS graduate is now a student at the Edeline Training Center, a Portland modeling school. Other contestants in-
